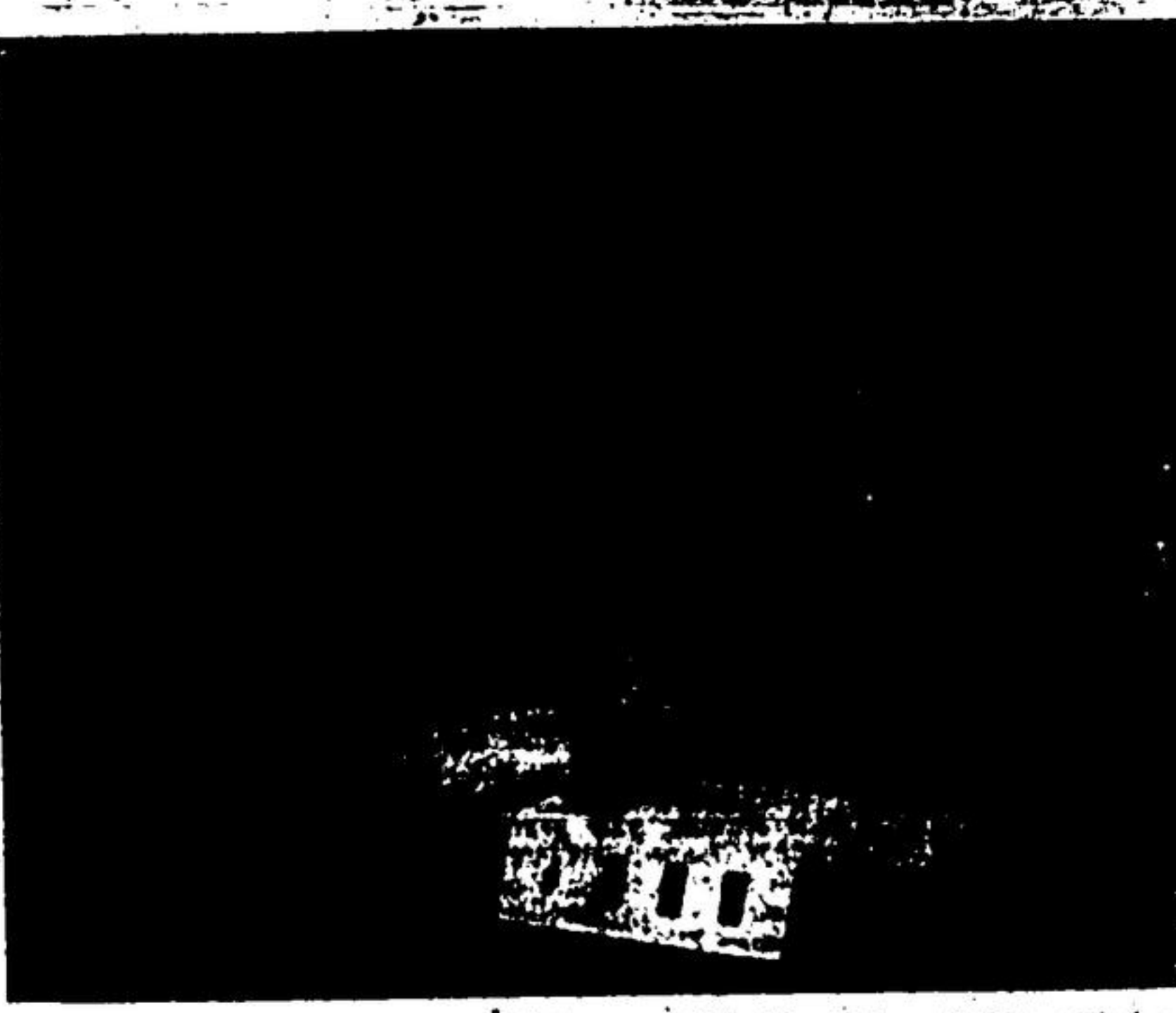

Exam Results Secret? GDHS Principal Disagrees

The Georgetown and District High School Board was urged by the Secondary School Headmasters' Association Monday to reverse its policy and stop publishing the results of final examinations and promotions.

In a letter, the Headmasters Association claimed the publication of marks led to unfair criticism and comparisons.

"As a result of such publications in the press, conclusions are reached by the general public which are based on partial information," stated the letter.

It said that the Secondary School Headmasters of the Province were quite concerned about results and promotions being published, and that the matter was discussed at last summer's conference for Headmasters at Carleton University.

"The principals are convinced that such information is of a personal nature and the concern of the school authorities, parents, and students only the Headmaster Association claims.

The Headmasters suggested that names of winners of scholarships and other awards in Grade 12 should be the only information released.

J. L. Lambert, principal of Georgetown and District High School didn't agree with views of his fellow Headmasters.

"The public has a right to know what's going on," he said. "We don't emphasize failures by publishing their names, but the promotion lists and results of final examinations go into the paper. The School does have an obligation to the public to make the results known," he said.

The board took no action on the Secondary School Headmasters recommendation.
