Missionary's Mother Gives Impressions India Visit

India is a land of contrasts — a land of beauty and a land of equalor — a land of wealth and a land of great poverty. So spoke Mr. and Mrs. G. Dean Maxwell of Toronto, who showed slides of their recent four month visit in India with their daughter, Margaret, who is a missionary nurse.

Touching only briefly on some of the other spots they visited in their round-the-world tour, the couple concentrated mainly on their travels in India. Punctuating their remarks with humour, and at times pathos, the couple spoke interestingly of his in the large cities as well as in the rural towns and villages as they showed their many wonderful coloured slides.

As an engineer, Mr. Maxwell was particularly interested in some of the schemes to harness water to irrigate the dry and arid land where water is at such a premium. "Even now, as my kitchen tap and see the water gushing forth, I think of the women I saw carrying as much as 40 lbs. of water on their heads at one time, and carrying it for distances of up to a mile."

The occasion was the Easter Thank-Offering meeting of the Knox Auxiliary of the Women's Missionary Society. Mrs. John Colter, the president, was in the chair and welcomed the members and their guests. Mrs. Cam Sinclair gave the Easter reading and meditation and Miss Brogford led in prayer.

Two members of the OGTF, Peggy Given and Jane Graff, together with Joanne Mitchell, formed a trio and sang the lovely sacred song "In The Garden". They were accompanied by Mrs. R. T. Paul.

Mrs. Norman Young expressed the appreciation of all to Mr. and Mrs. Maxwell and thanked all those who had helped in any way to make the evening a success.
