

Population Dips By 800 As Hockey Kids Head Home

A well balanced hockey machine from Manitoba clicked for 5 goals and allowed none in sweeping to the International Hockey Hockey tournament Grand Championship here Saturday night.

The Winnipeg crew captured the A Division championship earlier the same day by topping Guelph 6-1 and then bested Leamington, C Division champions 4-3 in the Grand Championship semi-final.

Galt, which won the B Division title, 3-1 over Chatham, Guelph, D Division champs, 3-1 to gain a shot at the Grand Championship in the final game with Winnipeg.

The westerners scored twice in the first period and three times in the second in bringing Galt's march to a halt. Altonara paced his mates with a pair. Johnston, Oddleifson and Howie netted the others.

Winnipeg edged past Leavack 3-2 to win the D series honours and Leamington trounced by Lindsay 8-3 in taking the C crown.

A crowd in excess of 800 witnessed the Grand finale, the best of 80 Eastern hockey games scheduled into Easter week.

The tournament was the 8th annual and, according to regular participants, the best yet.

A Galt defenseman, Peter Berkley (No. 6), was judged the tournament's Most Valuable Player.

While in town, players of teams coming from too much of a distance to commute were

billeted in Georgetown homes through a billeting system supervised and managed by Mrs. Ida Alcorn. They received dinner and supper at the Legion hall, the IOOF hall, and St. John's Church hall, from town and district women's groups under Mrs. Jessie Hayes. The referee-in-chief was Brian Lewis, and Roy Norton Sr. handled the financing end of it.

In the hub of the off-the-ice work were Mr. and Mrs. Walter "Red" Asseltine, the tournament president and secretary respectively.

The tournament involved some 43 teams and gave close to 800 young players a perfect way to spend the holidays.
