Smith & Stone, Duplate Give Hospital Heart Station

Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital Board last week, from Brigadier F. C. Wallace, D.S.O., M.C., chairman of the Board of Smith and Stone Ltd., and Duplate of Canada Ltd. The heart station is being donated by the two companies in memory of the late Col. Eric Phillips, C.B.E., D.S.O., M.C., L.L.D., who died on Dec. 20th, 1964.

This latest gift of the local company, underscores the intense interest taken by the firm in the welfare of the community. Smith & Stone was a major contributor in the campaign to build the local hospital.

The Heart Station, as it is called, consists of an Electrolytic Synchronizer, Defibrillator, Cardioscope and Pacemaker.

This is the latest equipment in the treatment of heart disease.

The equipment is very portable, allowing use in various parts of the hospital at one time. The Defibrillator is an electronic apparatus which is used to "shock the heart back to life" when it has suddenly stopped beating effectively. This was being used on the outside of the chest or inside the chest cavity during operation. It is an apparatus which fortunately is seldom used, but when needed it is life saving.

The Cardioscope and Synchronizer are elaborate electronic innovations which record visually and audibly the heart beat. This is connected to the patient and is used in a seriously ill cardiac patient to monitor the heart rate. If the rate or rhythm is altered radically, an alarm is set off which alerts the nursing team and the medical staff that this heart may stop.

At this point the Pacemaker is used to shock the heart back to a regular rhythm. Also, due to the warning, the medical team is now ready to take further action if necessary.

The Pacemaker is also used to change abnormal heart rhythms back to normal. This could only be done by drugs before and often unsuccessfully.

There is also a transistorized pacemaker which can be attached to a patient and keep the heart beating regularly while he is being transferred to a specialized centre... such as Toronto, for further definitive treatment.

Hospital chief of staff Dr. A. Thompson had this to say: "Naturally the medical staff are most pleased about this new equipment. The entire piece of equipment will enable the Georgetown Hospital to give the best up to date and effective emergency treatment possible for coronary and other heart disease patients."

Georgetown Area Jerseys Earn Places in the Record Book

A number of Georgetown area Jerseys have made names for themselves in the production records according to recent releases from the Canadian Jersey Cattle Club.

The highest senior two-year old record in Canada in April was made by Nurseland Favourite Kim, bred and owned by Fred Nurse, Georgetown. At two years 197 days, she produced 8,012 lbs. of milk, 420 lbs. of fat, 5.24 per cent.

In the junior two-year old class, a Jersey in another area heard, Castor's Susan, bred and owned by Ernest Alexander of Norval had the Canadian high record. In 305 days, at 2 years and 58 days of age, she produced 9,765 lbs. of milk, 500 lbs. fat, 5.12 per cent. This is a Silver Medal record.

Rada's Daisy 4T, bred and owned by Bruce Nixon, Norval, was second in the senior yearlings class for the same month. This heifer produced at 1 year 352 days, 7,189 lbs. of milk, 362 lbs. fat, 5.04 per cent.

Three Jerseys in the herd Ken Ella and Son Hornby have been awarded Ton of Gold certificates for producing at least 2,000 lbs. of fat in 4 consecutive years. They are Rock Ella Sporting Diane, also a winner of
