## LET'S PLAY BRIDGE

It is surprising how much trust you can put in the bidding of the opponents. Since they are trying to convey information to each other then bidding ought to be logical. If an opponent opens the bidding it is usually safe to assume that he holds about 13 points. If an opponent rebids a suit it's fairly certain that he has at least five cards in that suit.

A bridge player usually pays some attention to the opponents bidding, but a good bridge player pays close attention to what the opponents are trying to tell each other.
