**TWO HURT IN MOTORCYCLE ACCIDENTS**

A Norval teenager, Diane Cooley, was treated for cuts, bruises and shock at Georgetown & District Memorial Hospital on Tuesday after the motorcycle she was riding on as a passenger collided with the side of a truck opposite Halton Co-Op Supplies, 45 Guelph St., at noon Tuesday.

Police said the motorcycle bounced off the right front fender of the 1962 GMC Halton Co-Op truck as the truck started a right turn off the highway. Both the truck and the motorcycle were westbound on Guelph Street.

The truck was driven by James Harold Jackson, R.R. 1, Hillsburgh, and the motorcycle by Paul Underhill, Georgetown. Underhill was knocked off his vehicle but escaped injury.

It was the second accident involving a light motorcycle within a week.

Thursday afternoon, police investigated an accident at the corner of Guelph and Queen St. where motorcyclist Frank Van DeValk, 30 Arletta St., suffered bruises and abrasions of both legs when his bike hit a 1955 Dodge driven by Donald G. Sanderson, Terra Cotta.

DeValk, 17, was westbound on Guelph St. when he collided with the car making a left turn onto Queen Street.

Damage was estimated at \$100 to the 1963 Honda motorcycle, and \$75 to the Sanderson car.

**Four Georgetown Cadets Sign for Summer Training**

Four Georgetown youths will receive training at the sixth annual Student Militia Summer Training Program in Brampton from July 5 to mid-August.

Fred Yates, Garth Marchment, Peter Ming, and John Campbell will be with 36 other trainees and five instructors when the course commences at the Lorne Scot Armoury. It will be headed by Major A. V. Goodman.

Most taking part in the program are high school cadets from Brampton, Georgetown, Oakville and surrounding area.

The first year of the course is a "recruit training" program including drill, weapons training, national survival, field craft, map using, and first aid. Those passing their first aid will qualify for a St. John Ambulance certificate.

The students will be on the firing ranges for three days and also will take part in a two-day bivouac, cooking "right in the field."

If the students want to continue their training they may do so in the second year by taking a junior NCO course at a command camp such as Camp Niagara. This course is also for five weeks.

In the third year, the students who graduate from the NCO course come back to Brampton and train the first year students.

These students are recognized by the Army as potential officers and NCOs.

Students chosen must join the militia prior to the course.

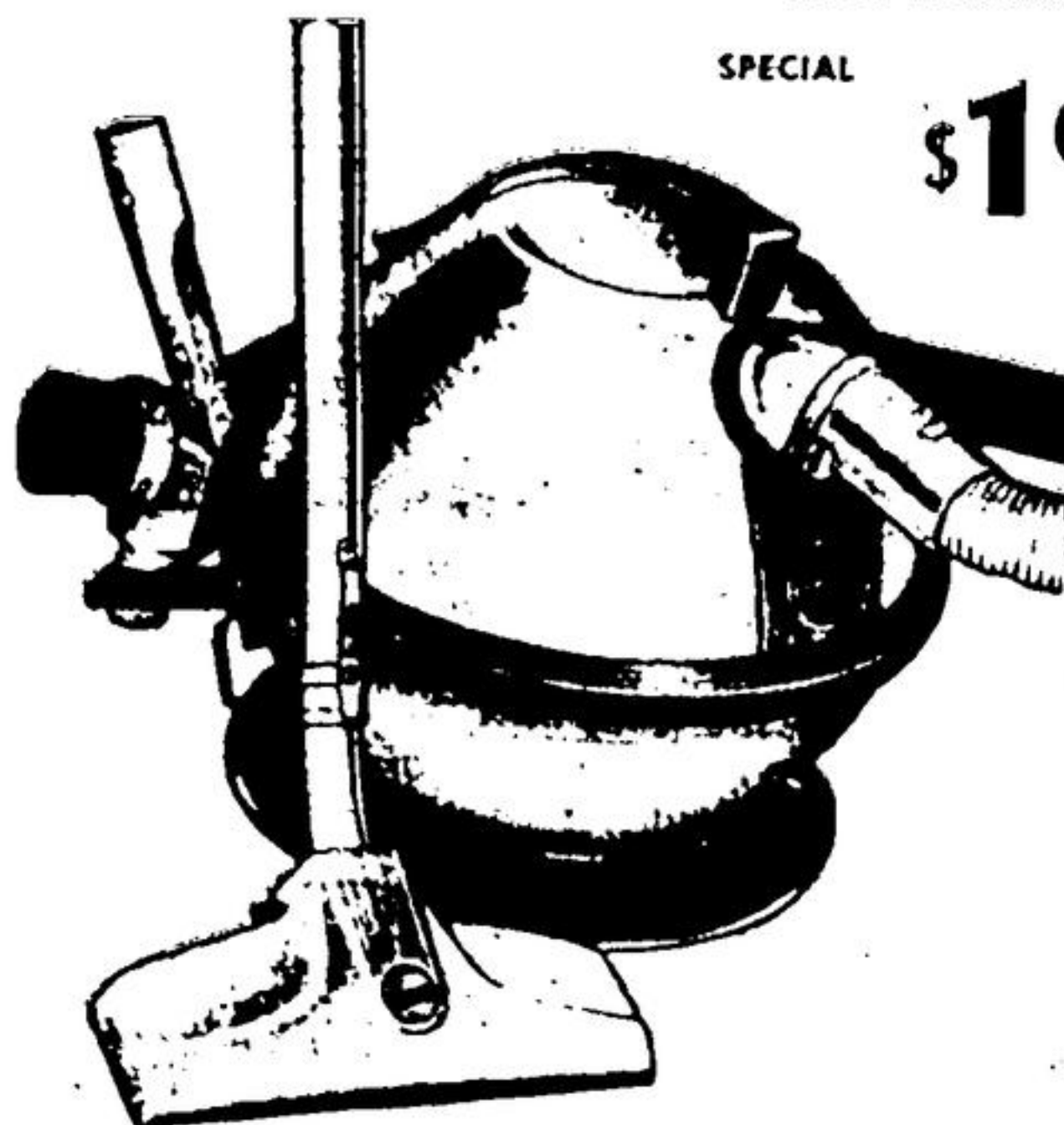

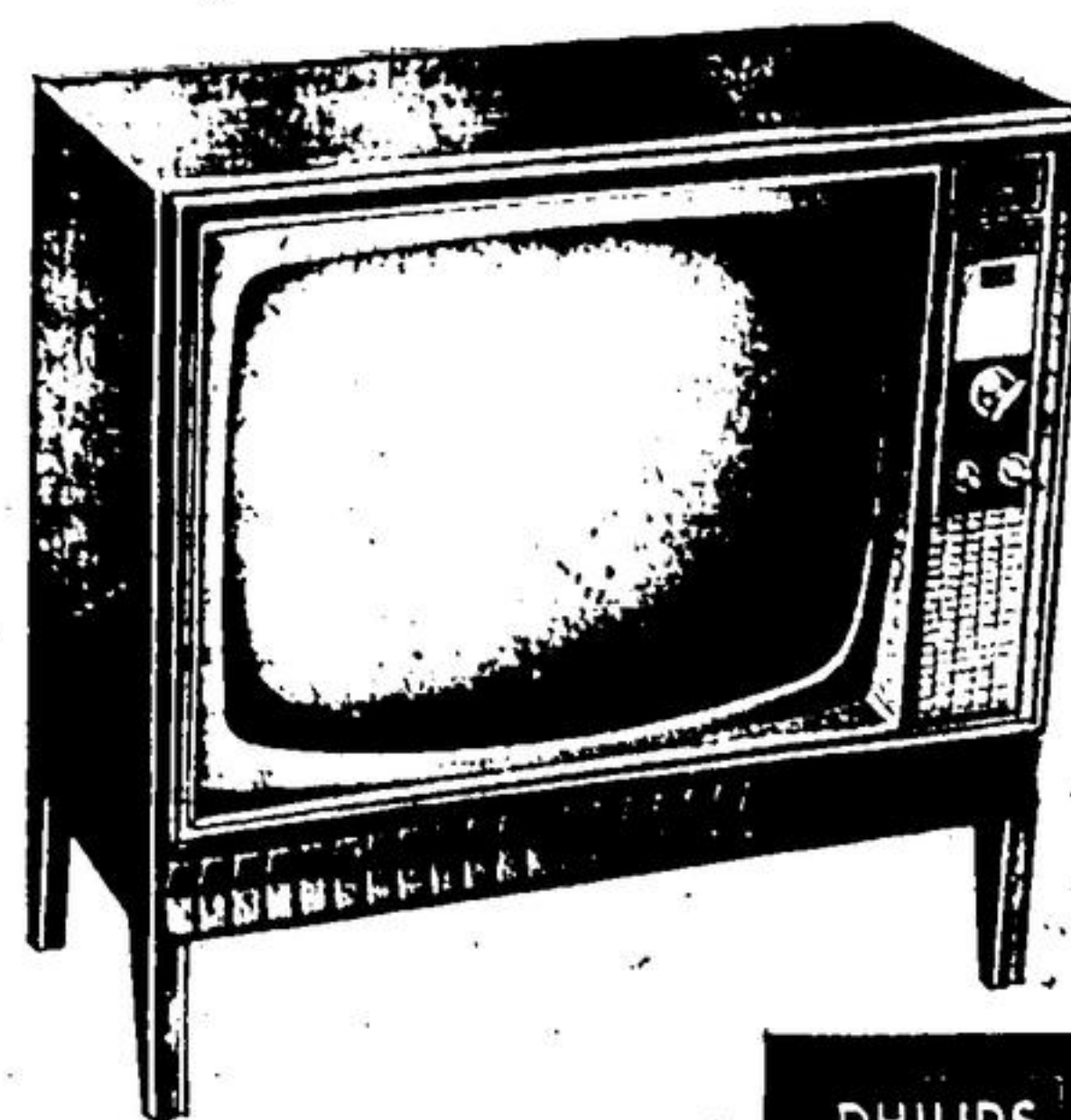
