Georgetown purchased a new Pontiac police cruiser Monday from Masson Motors.

Council voted to accept the firm's tender price of \$1,083 plus trade in of the old cruiser. At the meeting council also:

- Offered \$3,000 to the Turnbull estate for two lots at the John - McNeill corner which cannot be built on because the land is zoned for conservation.
- Accepted a \$1,300 offer from Tom Rush for a building lot on Princess Anne Drive.
- Granted \$75 to the public school safety patrol towards a trip to Toronto.
- Released Bob Lane from a subordination agreement for a cash payment of \$4,325. Mayor Gibbons and Cr. Young voted against the proposal.
- Declined to supply water to a Wildwood property just out of town limits, which had been requested by K. Girvan.

DOG CONTROL OFFICER SIGNS WITH ACTON TOO

George Herrington of Limehouse has signed a three year agreement with Acton to provide dog control for that town. The agreement was approved on Tuesday night at council.

Under provisions of the new agreement, dogs picked up running at large will be taken to the dog pound at Limehouse and owners have to pay \$7 to recover them as well as \$2 per day for keep.

Mr. Herrington is also the dog control officer for Georgetown.
