Government Gives Nod to Glen Flood Improvement

Last week approval was received from the Provincial Government for grants on the preliminary engineering of the channel improvement at Glen Williams by the Credit Valley Conservation Authority.

The Federal Government turned down the overall flood control plan late in 1964. At the inaugural meeting in January, 1965, Chairman H.K. McMillan presented a program designed to alleviate a few of the most hazardous flood problems on the river.

"I am very pleased to report that, within six months and with the co-operation of the Authority members, especially Flood Control Advisory Board Chairman H.K. Parker, we have the approval, and preliminary engineering is proceeding on all these projects," Mr. McMillan said.
