

Concerned About Long Runs GVAS Limits to Local Area

Council approved a move by the Georgetown Volunteer Ambulance Service to cut down on long distance runs, when they endorsed a letter which will be sent to Milton OPP headquarters.

Many calls to accidents on Hwy. 401 precipitated the action. The letter stressed that no emergencies would be refused, but the GVAS would insist that the police or doctor try to obtain a commercial ambulance from a nearby area.

The GVAS would prefer to serve the area covered by the Georgetown Fire Area, since they were originally organized to serve the local citizens, according to President Dan Scarborough.

The ambulance corps feel that calls such as a recent one that involved a 60 mile round trip imposed a heavy burden on the employees of the volunteers, in addition to the physical burden on the men.

Mayor Gibbons assured President Scarborough that no criticism could be expected from Council, nor, he felt, from the taxpayers.
