Separate School Seeks Better Price On Land

Having read the land agreement between Delrex Developments Limited and The Corporation of the Town of Georgetown, the Separate School Board would like to comment on the following

Under the present agreement Delrex Developments Limited, has granted the School Boards in the Town of Georgetown the right to purchase land at a fixed price of \$3,000.00 per lot

In 1964 the Public Schools received approximately 5 acres of land for \$1.00 from the Town of Georgetown, and now Delrex Developments, Limited has agreed to sell to the Public School Board 7 lots at \$3,000.00 per lot, total cost for approximately 5 acres, \$21,000.00

Delrex Developments Limited has also agreed to sell to the Corporation of the Town of Georgetown 175 acres at \$100.00 per acre, for a total cost of \$17,500.00

It would appear, Mr. Editor, that the Separate School supporters of the Town of Georgetown are being asked to pay an exorbitant price for a school site under this agreement. We submit that the Separate School Board should be given the same consideration as has the Public School Board in the past

Limehouse Area Barn Is Destroyed, Tuesday Blaze

A large barn on the former Harold Barber farm near Limehouse was burned to the ground in a spectacular blaze Tuesday afternoon.

The barn was engulfed in flames when the fire was first noticed and by the time firemen arrived it was beginning to tumble.

Mr. Barber sold the farm to the government a year ago. It was completely empty.

Georgetown Fire Dept. answered the alarm at 2:20 p.m. but left it for the Action fire-fighters when it was discovered to be out of Georgetown's territory.

The barn measured 56 ft by 60 ft. and had had some rebuilding done to the interior in recent years. Mr. Barber operated a dairy farm when he had the property and new stabling had been installed before he sold it.

Mr. and Mrs. E. Laquet and family have lived in the farm house since April.

"My son noticed the barn in flames when he looked out the window," Mrs. Laquet told The Herald. "When I asked the operator to give me the fire department and give me the Georgetown department."

Action firemen stayed at the scene until only the stone foundation remained standing.

The farm house was never in danger.

The farm is on the 4th Line of Esquimaux near No. 22 sidewalk.
