**Fractured Limbs Result When Cycle Hits Truck**

Two motorcycle riders are in Georgetown Memorial Hospital today recovering from injuries sustained when the light weight motorcycle they were riding on rammed the front of a pickup truck opposite Wheelers store in Glen Williams Wednesday Aug. 4.

Sandy Lorrman, 14 of Glen Williams who was steering the bike suffered a fractured right leg and fractured right arm, and the passenger, John Hamilton, 17, 60 Main Street North, Georgetown, has a fractured right thigh.

Official word from Georgetown Memorial Hospital this week said both were in "satisfactory" condition.

Ontario Provincial Police Constable Carman Wright said the pair had just rounded a corner in front of the store when they collided with the front end of the truck which was coming to a stop when the accident happened.

He placed the damage to the motorcycle at \$250 and to the truck, operated by Harvey Garvin, Glen Williams, at \$100.

The injured pair were taken to hospital by the Georgetown Volunteer Ambulance Service. The accident happened at 6:50 p.m.

The latest in a series of motorcycle accidents occurred Saturday when two 17 year old boys were injured after their bike left the 7th Line Road near Stewarttown.

Both Gordon Morrison of Streetsville, the driver and Gary Stoddart of Brampton, were treated at Georgetown Memorial Hospital and released the same day.

Morrison suffered contusions to his left knee and Stoddart received multiple lacerations.
