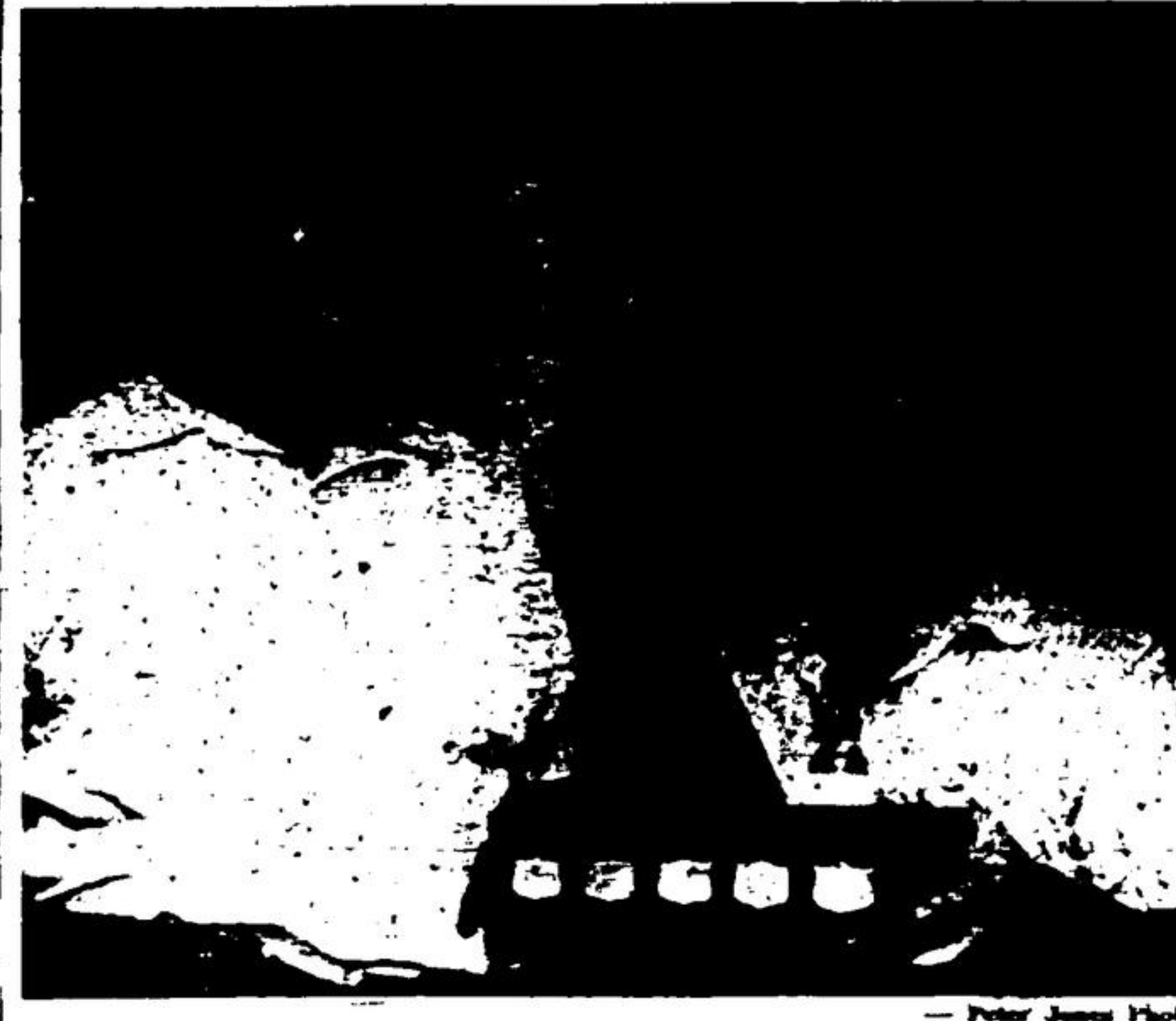

Statement of Industrial Commission

During recent years the industrial growth of Georgetown has been slower than that of neighbouring communities. A settled political climate is an essential requirement for more new industries. This includes harmonious relationship between developers and the municipality. Industrial land controlled by the town would facilitate negotiations for new industries and the retaining of our present industries.

Georgetown has many advantages for new industry, but in order to attract industry the above requirements must be met. We feel the Town of Georgetown has negotiated a fair agreement with Delrex Developments Ltd. which protects the position of the present residents and helps solve the above problems.

The continued growth of Georgetown will depend upon attracting new industry. With the help of all the citizens of Georgetown, we are sure we can help Georgetown live up to its name "The Industrious Town."
