Tom Forgrave Writes Saturday Night in Thorsby

Night descends softly on the village, almost unnoticed. In the light of the waning full moon the United Grain Grower's elevator sports its fresh white coat and bright blue emblem. It and its two companion elevators will likely be full in a few weeks.

Night descends almost unnoticed because this is Saturday night in Thorsby, Alberta. The main street is bright with the light of mercury vapour streetlights and the headlights of the cars driving back and forth.

At midnight, when the hotel awakes, the street will be noisy and bustling. The cars will leave and deposit their passengers back on their farms. But these few hours are the quietest time of the district. Five thousand pigs sold are typical phrases echoing around the street.

Guard Freedom of Press Says New Head of CWNA

Weekly editors must be continually conscious of the increased effect of government controls of Canadian freedom of the press, said Mr. J. L. McKenna, newly elected president of the Canadian Weekly Newspaper Association, said in his inaugural address.

"Some politicians would be only too happy to inflict a controlled press on those they claim to represent," said Mr. McKenna. Despite this pressure, he said, weekly newspapers must continue to serve the best interests of our people by informing our readers of what is going on and, where necessary, by providing leadership through editorial comment.

Mr. McKenna said that weekly publishers can best serve this purpose by printing out good newspapers which attain high readability and respect in their communities.

"We have a great number of free thinkers in Canada," he said, "and free thinking may have some useful purpose. But sensible thinking is far more important to Canada and it is
