

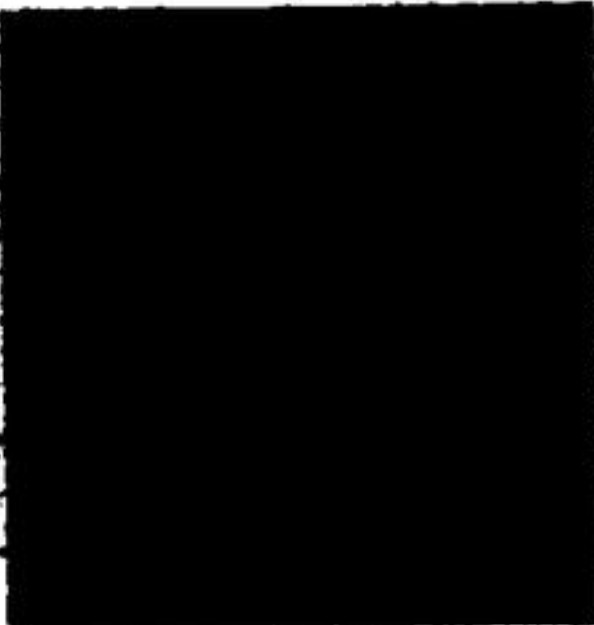
Men From S&S, Plax Well 25 Year Club
