**Nurse Spearheads Rebs to Win Against St. Jerome's**

Jeff Nurse, Georgetown High school Rebels' fullback, ran for three touchdowns as the Rebs opened their 1965 campaign with a stunning 30-0 rout of the much feared St. Jerome's of Kitchener senior football team Friday.

The balance of the scoring came on pass plays from Rebs quarterback Phil Lavell to brother Pete Lavell and Wayne Turnbull.

The Rebels had their problems hanging on to the football in the second quarter, but their fumbles allowed the defence to display their heroics and goal line stands. The half ended 12-0.

Nurse rambled over twice

In the third period, both times after Rebs had moved into position on long passes to Lavell and Mackenzie to make it 24-0. Georgetown's last score came on an end zone pass to Wayne Turnbull to beat his coverage neatly to get into the open.

In all, Rebs offense gained 300 yards.

Georgetown seniors play their second game of the schedule today in Georgetown park. Ferguson, a question mark team which is making its first appearance in District 10 League this season, will be the opponent.
