Moore Park Subdivision is Next For Council Decision

A motion which would bar issue of any commercial building permits in the Moore Park subdivision was defeated on a 4-4 council vote Monday.
 It was pointed out by Cr. George Hewson that a registered plan exists for the property and certain areas are commercially zoned.
 "If an application were made for a building permit there, we would have no legal right to refuse it," he said.
 Mayor Gibbons observed that property owner Miss Moore would be in an unusual position as she has successfully won an assessment appeal to have the land taxed as farm property.
 The mayor, Crs. Francis and Powers sided with Cr. Hewson in defeating the motion. Only eight councillors were at the meeting, with Deputy Reeve (Hunter absent for the night).
 The subdivision land has been optioned by Town Wide Investments, with the option lapsing on an agreement which that firm is negotiating with council.
 "As much as I would like to see the agreement in its present form," said Cr. Jim Young, "the deputy reeve made a wild statement recently that if the Delrex agreement passed, Moore Park would pass. I would say that Moore Park is as far away as Delrex was a year ago."
 Mr. Young said there should be many clauses in a Moore agreement similar to those which a recently-passed Delrex agreement contains.
 Cr. Powers took an opposing view, "It appears Town Wide is being pushed around by the planning board and now by council," he said. "They have agreed to pay \$400 per lot in lieu of industrial assessment and that's more than the Delrex agreement gives us."
 Mr. Powers said Mr. Jordan of The Town Wide firm has negotiated in good faith, and that the town needs competitive commercial and residential land.
 "Remember, he could develop the subdivision under an agreement made with the firm which originally planned development there," he said.
 Cr. Young argued that in the case of the Delrex agreement, sale of industrial land each as has been made last week will bring the town \$22,000 a year in tax revenue, while the \$400 per lot payment is a one-time transaction.
 In the Lane subdivision, the \$400 per lot payment is passed on to the buyer, said Cr. Roy Ballentine.
 "This doesn't tie the developer down," he said. "We should either require him to bring industry, or wait until it comes before residential building."
 Cr. Powers said this statement is inconsistent with the town's new Delrex agreement, and that a deposit on each lot is desirable.
