Three are Injured in Motor Accident
Two people suffered whiplash and another lacerated arms in a rear end collision early Sunday morning on Delrex Blvd. Treated for whiplash were Nelly Bell, 49 Delrex Blvd., and Elita Jackson, 446 Willis Dr., Oakville.
