Junior Raiders Make Debut Here This Sunday Afternoon

The first clue to how Georgetown Junior Raiders might stack up in the O.H.A. Central Ontario Junior C loop this season should come out of an exhibition game which pits the former Beavers against last year's league finalists, Milton Merchants, at Georgetown arena Sunday afternoon.

Both clubs have lost some strength due to age limit but both have also added muscle from unexpected sources as well as midjet and juvenile grade. Georgetown Raiders have been working out about a week longer than Merchants, under a new coach, Gerry Inglis, who guided Georgetown midjets to the Ontario title last season.

An abundance of goal tenders has been one of the good things about the Raiders' pre-season sessions. At their most recent workout no fewer than six netters took a turn at shedding shots including Cuthbert and Cowbrough who played for last year's team and are still eligible.

Defense will be made up of the best of Gerry Riddall, Rod Presswood, Terry Burke and Brent Telford of last year's club, Danny Arble of Acton, and a Harby product Art Brooks.

In scrimmage the line combinations have been Maloney from Brampton Juniors, Mike Cummins from Burlington B's and Terry Hay, Mike Dwyer and Paul Robinson, the high scoring pair from Georgetown Midjets, with Donnie Norton, Doug Selby, Ronnie Lann and Simon Llewellyn, a Georgetown Juvenile who played junior in the 1965 playoffs; Phil Marro from Arton Juniors and Dave Sheppard also being used in the juggling act that will produce the 1965-66 edition.

The juniors lost three regulars, Bill Campbell, Glen Cooper, and Murray Marchment to age, and another Jan Popiel has caught a berth with the St. Catharines Tee Pees.
