Low Water Plagues Huttonville Residents
Some Huttonville residents are having river problems again, but instead of flooding as it was in the spring it's now low water troubles.

The current trouble began last Sunday when the sluice gate burst and the water poured out of the mill pond. In the remaining shallow water fish died. The sluice is unrepairable, according to Mrs. Etta Prue, who reports several inches of slime adding to the trouble.

Mrs. Prue, who resides on River Rd., said she had been told by the head of the Credit Valley Conservation Authority, Volney McMillan, that special logs for the sluiceway had been cut in September and were drying in the Hillsburgh area, while the owner of the dam claimed that the proper logs were not put in the gate the last time, and the pressure of the water caused them to buckle and break \$80 prize money.

Almost Half Saying No To Y Campaigners

Early processing is indicating that close to 50 per cent of the people canvassed by the Georgetown YMCA-WYCA during their drive for funds chose not to donate.

At press time yesterday 2612 cards had been returned to Y headquarters by canvassers but just under 900 had been processed by the Y office staff.

Of the processed card 471 indicated donations and 423 indicated the house holder chose not to donate.

To date the canvass has accounted for \$2768.14, about a third of the Y's \$8,000 target figure. But most of the canvass area is still to be heard from.

Of 29 cards sent out in the industrial end of the canvass 3 have been returned, and none of the 184 commercial cards have been turned in.

There have been 29 donations and 6 rejections in Stewarttown where 47 cards have still to be turned in.

From Limehouse where 144 cards have been issued to canvassers there have been 12 returned, 9 containing donations.

There are no returns from Norval and Glen Williams where 80 and 302 cards respectively have been issued to canvassers.

A Y official told The Herald that if the canvass falls short of its goal it will probably mean the organization will have to fold.

GEORGETOWN MAN HENRY TIMMINS 4th CANDIDATE

The federal election race in Halton riding became a four man contest this week when Henry Timmins, R.R.-2, Georgetown tossed his hat in the ring as a Conservative Independent.

Mr. Timmins was a candidate in the last election and polled 500 votes. He says his chances appear better this time mainly because he is better known now and because he has a number of helpers who are working hard for his election.

Mr. Timmins says he believes the main issue in the November 8 election is getting rid of the Liberal party. He scored their foreign policy and terms their issue of divided Canada "phony."

Others seeking to represent the riding in Ottawa are Liberal Dr. Harry Harley, Progressive Conservative Allan Masson, and N.D.P. Murray Kernighan.
