North Halton Shareholders Okay Proceed to 18 Holes

North Halton Golf and Country Club shareholders voted to proceed with the completing stage of the club's course expansion project at a general meeting Wednesday, October 20.

A vote of 205 to 54 gave the directors a mandate to go ahead with the balance of the construction necessary to convert the course from 9 to 18 holes.

Members were able to play on nine holes with a minimum of inconvenience this season while the first stage on the construction project was undertaken. They will still play on a nine hole course next year but the 1966 course will be made up for the most part of different holes.

The directors expect the 18 hole layout to be completed by 1967.
