Set Three Performances For "Taming of the Shrew"

It's opening night tonight (Thursday) for the Georgetown Little Theatre's production of "The Taming of the Shrew" — the Shakespearean play that has since formed the basic plot for innumerable Hollywood plays on the same theme.

In the high school production, Petruchio (Ron Ehn) will woo and eventually win the Shrew (Vera Macdonald) for three nights in a row, Thursday, Friday and Saturday.

The atmosphere of 17th century has been created by set designer Lynne Hyde, while the costumes of the period have been designed and made by his wife Kitty.

Featured in the large cast demanded by a story within a story, such as this is, are Lucentio (Ron Ehn), a gay, wily student of Bianca, played by Ann Fisher, and Gremio (Gus Long), the older, rival suitor.

Also in the cast are Fred Roberts, Don Cooley, Chris Fisher, Al Sutherland, Gord Hunt, Ross McCluskey, Peter Macdonald, and Betty Fisher.

Heart Attack Last Week S&S Engineer Dies
A health and Stone engineering manager who suffered a heart attack in the company parking lot last week died Sunday night in Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital.
Fergus Stewart Mackay became plant manager of Piix in Georgetown in 1956 and has been with Smith and Stone most of the period since as engineering manager.
Mr. Mackay moved to Guelph from Oshawa in 1961, and for eight years was plant manager of Fiberglas Canada Ltd. in Guelph.
He was a member of the Industrial section of the Chamber of Commerce and also served a term as chairman of the Guelph General Hospital board. Mr. Mackay remained a member of the board since assuming his post as plant manager at Piix, Canada, in Georgetown.
He was also a member of the Cullen Club and a former member of the Guelph Rotary Club.
Born in Picton, Nova Scotia, Mr. Mackay was a graduate of Picton Academy, Dalhousie University and McGill University. A brilliant scholar, he was awarded the British Association Medal and other awards when he received his Bachelor of Science and Engineering degree from McGill in 1934. He was the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. John W. Mackay, QC. of Picton, N.S.
He worked in Hamilton as chief radio consultant for Westinghouse until World War II, and was engaged in secret work for Research Enterprise Ltd. during the war.
