## Fell Asleep in the Fog Car Clubber Fined \$100

An officer in a Georgetown car club who left his car parked crossways on a road in dense fog, was fined \$100 by court for having care and control of a car while his ability was impaired.

The 23 year old R.N. 2, Georgetown resident also had his license suspended for six months. The court was told the accused had consumed six pints of beer or the equivalent of

also ounces of alcohol. Robert Grguras of R.N. 2 Georgetown told the court that he didn't see the accused's car and struck it broadside at 40 miles per hour. He said he couldn't see the car because of the fog. He added the car did not have its lights on.

The accident occurred at the 8th Line Exchanging and No. 10 Sideroad, Grguras said the accused was asleep in the car. "I roused him. He said he was okay and then passed out," Grguras stated. The accused slept until police arrived at the accident scene.

"When the police roused him, he didn't answer in a very nice way," Grguras said. "He told the constable in a very brief way where to go."

The constable then dragged the accused out of the car and took him to the Milton detachment of the O.P.P. Grguras was cited by the defense counsel William Sharpe as giving evidence very fairly.

The accused said he left the car across the road when he failed to make a turn and got stuck. He said he went to sleep after making one try to move it.

Constable Thomas Duby said it was extremely foggy when the accident occurred. He said flames had to be put on the road the fog was so thick.

"No person perfectly sober could consider leaving a car in such a dangerous position," Magistrate Kenneth Leung don't noted in passing sentence.
