The best showing by a Georgetown high school football team since the school entered the tough CWOSSA District 10 league is the record of GDHS Rebels who concluded their 1965 schedule Thursday with a display of power.

The Rebs chalked up win number 3 by steamrolling over Milton high school seniors 37 to 0. In their six game slate they were stopped just once, and then by John F. Roas who went on to an undefeated season and the title.

Georgetown finished a strong second, and came out of the season with an important honour, the league's individual scoring championship. Jeff Nurse topped the title with a 10 touchdown performance, and gave Milton a private exhibition of his ability by scoring two majors against them, even though coach Lyn McLaren used him sparingly.

"Milton has a good club, but the score could have been higher," coach McLaren commented after. "Jeff (Nurse) carried the ball only three times and he scored on two of them."

Both of Nurse's romps were from forty yards out. He scored the first touchdown of the ball game on a wide pitchout in the first quarter. Bob McKay also ran for a TD from about 15 yards away. This one was converted and the Rebels had a 13-0 edge at the half.

Nurse's third quarter scoring play was identical to the first,

and this was followed up by TDs from quarterback Phil Lawell on a sneak play, Hurrows on a reverse, and Hillis who gathered in a pass on the last play and scampered 55 yards into the Milton end zone.

St. Jerome finished third behind John F. Roas and Georgetown. Guelph Collegiate was fourth, Milton fifth and Ferigus sixth.

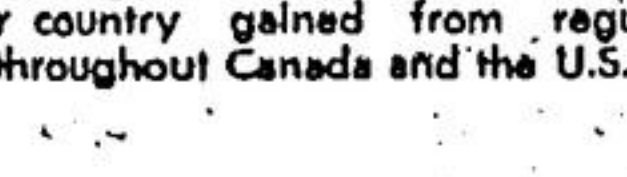
