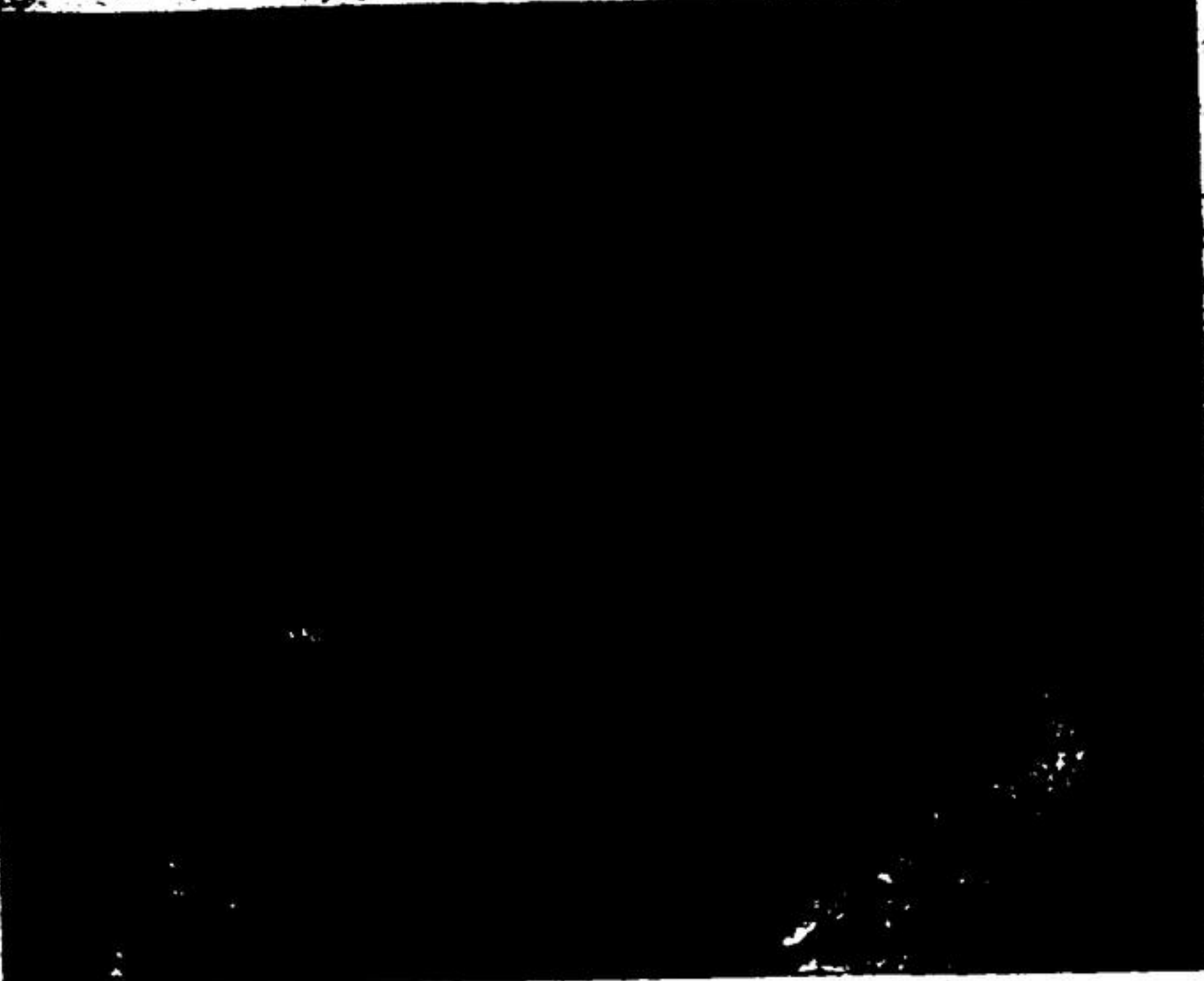
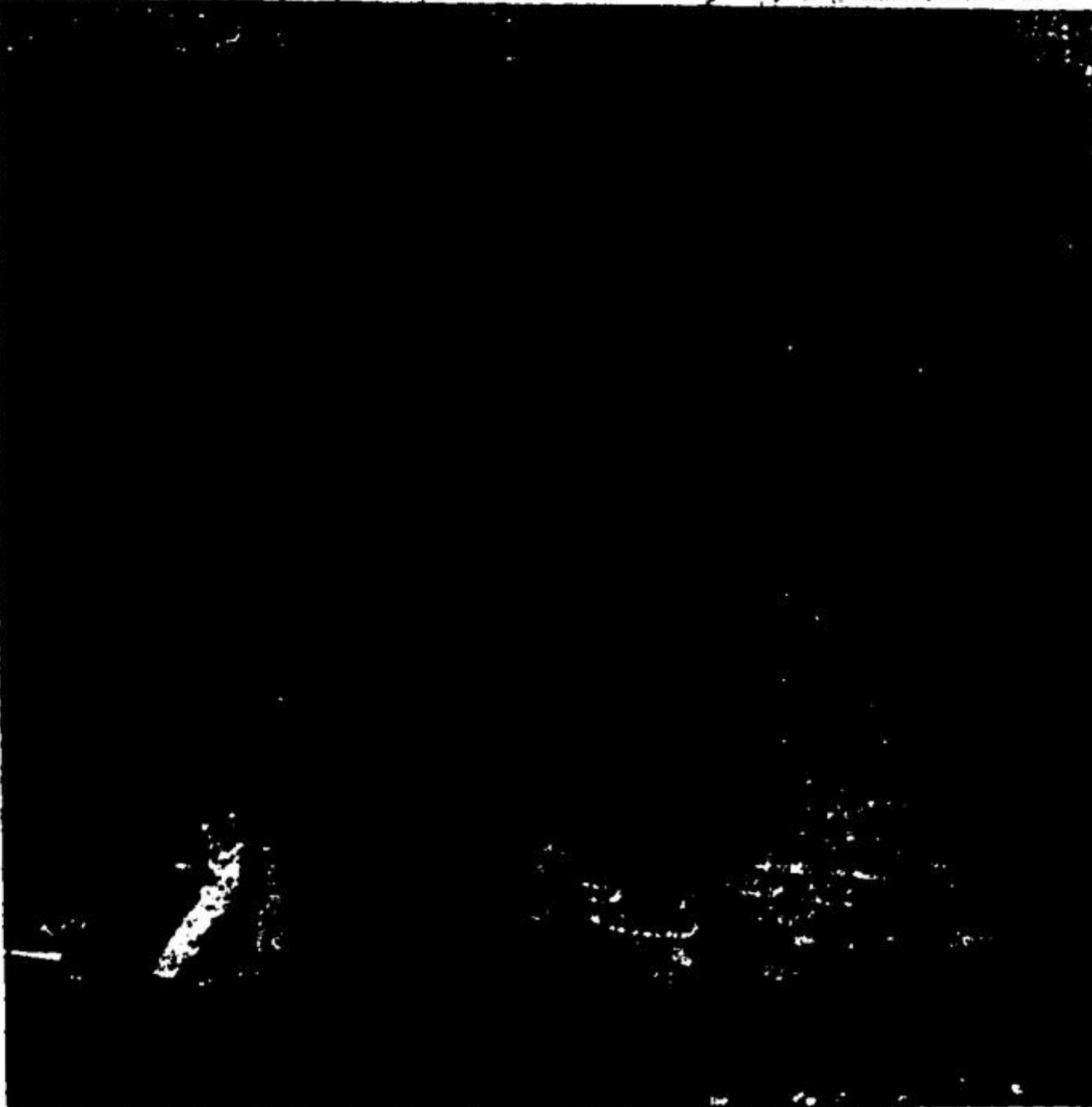


DEDICATED DOZEN RACE WITH THE SNOW
