

It is my desire, to as briefly as possible, give an account of my slewardship for my present term of office, which is now drawing to a close.

On numerous occasion, I have stated publicly and privately I would not accept the Mayor's salary. This promise has been kept in its entirety and if I should be re-elected that promise still stands.

Please believe me when I say this is not a vote getting "Stunt." It is certainly not a precedent. I submit that better men than I, have rendered service gratuitously to their fellow citizens, men such as the late LeRoy Dale, the late J. B. Mackenzie and many others who served their municipality faithfully and wall. Regardless of re-election, "I do not ask what Georgelown can do for me, but rather what I can do for this good old town of Georgetown."

Previous to my assuming office in 1964, the tax rate for the previous seven years increased each and every year. In the last two years against considerable opposition in council I was successful in preventing any Increase and with a co-operative council in 1966, we can have a revision of the tax rate downward. This can be accomplished without any interference with nacessary civic services.

Much has been said about the lack of harmony in the Municipal Council and the reason must be obvious to the citizens. If the 1966 council is composed of men, who have not an established ill-will toward me, without Interfering with their independence, then, I say our work in Council will be more easy and pleasant.

During the past year it is apparent that Georgetown is getting closer' to industrial expansion. In the near future we expect positive action in this direction. I hope and expect that soon there will be Georgetown employment for all Georgeown citizens. The best incentive to establishment of industry is a low tax-rate.

The finalizing of the purchase of the property for Georgetown's 1967 Centennial project has been completed and Georgetown people now, and in the future, from the senior citizens to the youth of the community may enjoy a place of natural beauy, a place of good clean sport and amusement, 'yes a place of joy for young and old to ever go.

I am offering my services to the Yown of Georgetown for the year 1966. If for any reason the electors decide that my services are no longer required, I assure you there will be no animosity in my heart whatsoever. But if my municipal record commends itself to you, if you think I have acted honestly, fearlessly, and Independently, for what I believe to be in the best interests of the people of the town of Georgetown; if you think I will continue to enact sound municipal legislation. then I shall appreciate your support at the polls Monday, December 6th-
