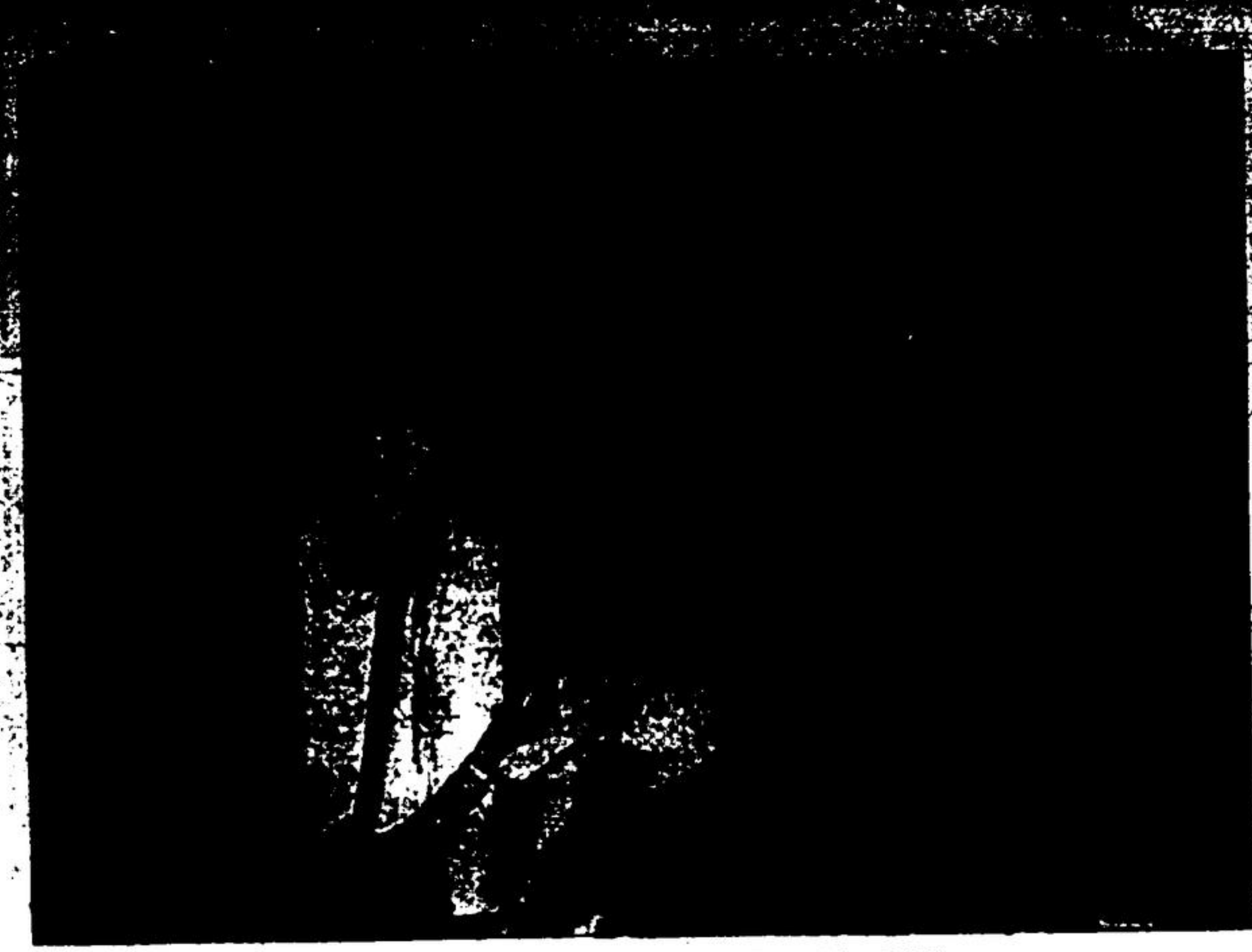

Both vehicles sped east on No. 7 Highway reaching speeds up to 80 miles per hour. Constable Harness radioed the North Halton OPP detachment for assistance during the chase. At the corner of No. 7 Highway and the 7th Line of Esqueewing, the chased car continued east on the slippery road failing to stop at the stop sign.

A southbound vehicle on the 7th Line braked to avoid striking the police cruiser following behind. After the youth's car had continued for a short distance on the slippery Silvercreek sideroad it was ditched and the driver and another unknown occupant took off on foot through the bush.

Dr. Brown, a former member of the Council's executive assistant to the president of Oshawa Wholesale, Ltd. Introducing him, Bob Lawson, who was a classmate in the '40 class at the Ontario Agricultural College, outlined his career which has included the vice presidency of the Canadian Horticultural Council and secretary-manager of the Ontario Fruit & Vegetable Growers. He has post graduate degrees from Michigan State and Cornell Universities. Dr. Brown is the son of Mr. & Mrs. Stanley Brown, R.R. 3, Milton.

The Ontario Food Council is an association of producers, processors, wholesalers and retailers which promotes Ontario produce in domestic and export markets. As one example of its success, he noted that export of fruit and vegetables to Britain has increased over six times since its formation.
