A letter from Dax Developments has asked for a refund from the town on installation of water and sewer lines.

They stated they had paid an extra eighty dollars to have the water and sewer lines put in separate trenches, both at 45 Maple West, and at 25 Markof streets, and this was not done. The lines were laid in the same trench.

Cous. Francis commented that he understood that all water and sewer lines were supposed to be put in separate trenches, commencing last spring. He promised it would be investigated.

### HIGHWAY ISLANDS

Two claims for damages when cars hit the island on the newly reconstructed No. 7 highway, sparked a full discussion at Tuesday's council meeting. Both claimants stated that the island were unlighted and unmarked.

The mayor felt the claims should be turned over to Armstrong Brothers Construction, while Cous Francis pointed out temporary lighting at least should be installed immediately.

However, Deputy Reeve Hunter brought in a motion to have the storm sewer connection in front of Woods Service Station fixed, since the last heavy rain had proved it had not been connected at the proper place. Added to that motion was a request that Dammas and Smith, the consulting engineers, be asked to consider the possibility of removing the islands at Maple and Guelph Streets.

Mayor Gibbons pointed out that the island were in the specifications and the plans, as a result the town would have to pay for removal.

The Department of Highways would not allow their removal, contended Councillor Powers, since they were put there to aid traffic flow.

Councillor G. Hewson agreed, and added that school children would find crossing impossible without them. He stressed they should be lit and marked.

Left and right turns would be impossible too, without the islands, Councillor J. Young maintained.

The motion passed six to three, with those in favour making it plain they were simply voting to discuss the islands, not remove them.
