## Merchants Tag Raiders Season's Second Loss

Georgetown Raiders' grip on first place on the top rung of the OHA Junior C Central League ladder was slackened in Milton Friday night when the Milton Merchants tagged the local with a 3-1 decision.

Milton's edge was just a single goal until the third period when they struck for 4 quick goals to put it out of reach. Georgetown didn't dent Merchants' net for Frank Marchiori's armour until a little more than a minute remained.

The Milton win made coach Murray Groat look like a master strategist. Because the Merchants had been held to a tie by Elmira in their last outing, Groat decided to switch defenseman Joe Hore to a forward line.

The move paid off in a big way as Hore exploded for three goals to spearhead the winners' assault.

This was only the second loss in twelve games for Raiders. Milton has lost just one in eleven starts.

A power play goal gave Milton their 1-0 lead in the first period. Roger Wilfong from Joe Hore accounted for that one at 9:33.

The scoreless middle period featured a battle between Milton's lanky Leo Stickle and Kent Robinson. They were assessed fighting majors.

Joe Hore struck at 5:42 and 6:26 of the third to break the game wide open, both from Stickle and Wilfong. Stickle picked up one for himself at 8:15 to make it 4-0, and then Hore topped his third without help at 13:56.

Georgetown's only goal came at 18:46; Paul Robinson spotting Marchiori's shot from Kiddall and Don Norton.

Marchiori was called on to make 36 stops, and Bob Cuthbert in the Raider goal handled 25.

The game was played in front of the largest crowd of the season in Milton area, over 800.

Raiders play in Orangeville tonight against the third place Orangeville Hornets and then host Hanover, Sunday. Next Tuesday they go against Dundas in Dundas.

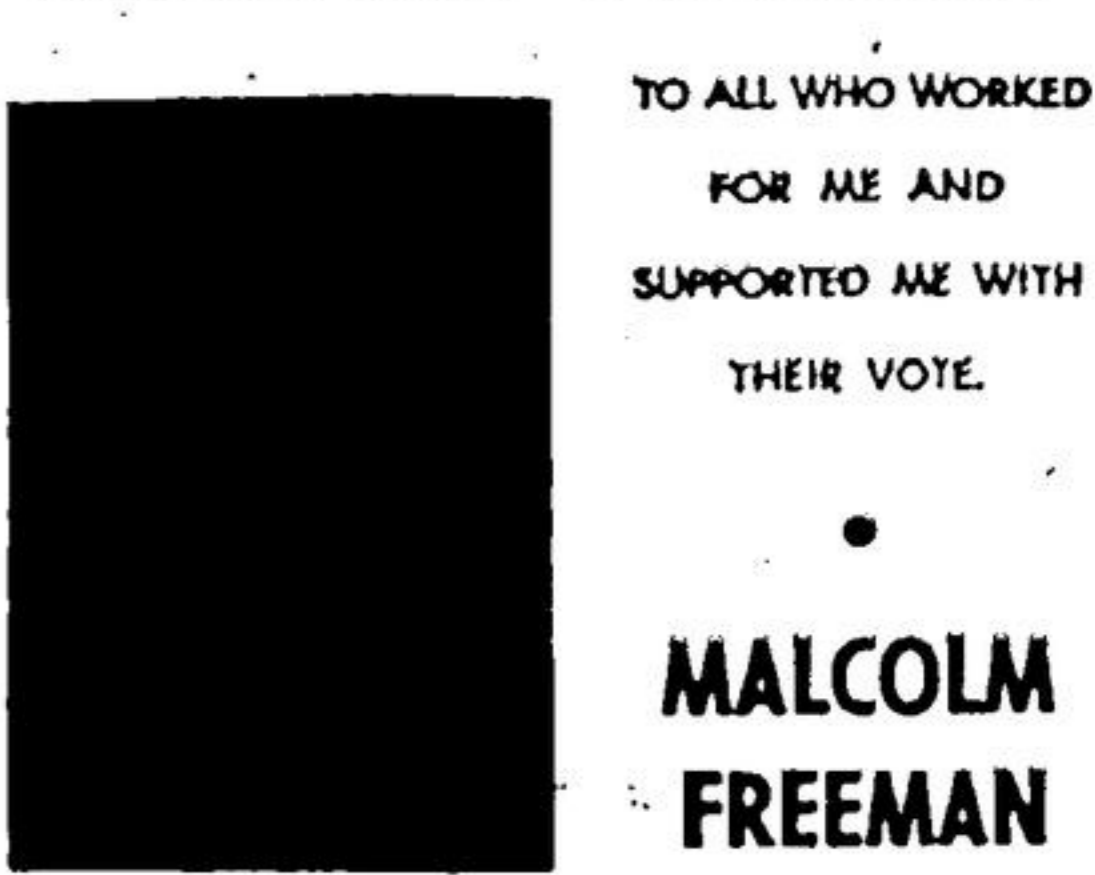
