Trap Drinking Drivers Spot Checks Planned

Drivers who are found to have been drinking will have their cars impounded and get some time in the county jail to think about all the slogans re mixing alcohol and gasoline. The warning was issued Monday by Georgetown Police Department Deputy Chief Robert Wilson.

He said the Georgetown department will crack down on drinking drivers, and beginning next week, will make spot checks. Employing the spot

check system of weeding the limbers out of the local traffic the police may stop any vehicle at any time and in any part of town to check on the condition of the driver.

The spot checks will be part of the on-duty officers' job until after New Year's.

The Georgetown police dept. hope the crackdown will keep the number of major accidents during 1965 under the 150 mark. At writing time there have been 138 major accidents (over \$100 property damage), and 91 minor crashes within town limits.

The figures are on a par with last year, but the major accidents are up about 25 over 1963.

A hundred and twenty nine people have been injured in local accidents, one of them fatally.
