Three Cars in Crash at Highway Intersection

Three cars were involved in a collision at the Mountainview Rd.—Guelph St. intersection Saturday causing over \$800 in property damage. One of the drivers Joseph Potvin, 35, of Toronto suffered the only injury, a scrape on his forehead.

Police said Potvin was westbound on Guelph St. and making a left turn onto Mountainview at the intersection when his car collided with an eastbound vehicle driven by John G. Bouchain, R.R. 2, Acton. The Potvin car was spun around by the impact and struck a third car stopped on Mountainview Rd. about to enter Guelph St.

The third vehicle was driven by Charles Pionffe of Ballinfad. Georgetown police constable Dave Bell estimated damage at \$820.

Another automobile accident the same day involved cars driven by Stanley Price, R.R. 1, Hornby, and George Grant Coulson, Milton.

Police said the Price car was leaving the Harley Motors lot on John St. W. and about to make a left turn onto John St. when the accident happened. Coulson was westbound on the street. A police report said the road was snow covered and slippery at the time. Property damage totalled \$150.

RULES TRACTOR IS NOT MOTOR VEHICLE

A charge of unlawfully operating a motor vehicle was dismissed against an R.R. 2, Georgetown teenager Monday because he drove a tractor.
