Maple Baptists Review 1965 Unveil Plans For Future

Last Wednesday Maple Avenue Baptist Church held its annual meeting for the year 1965. The records revealed another bonus year with giving increasing to an all time high of \$21,347.77, which was \$4,000 more than last year. 23 new members were added to the roll bringing the total membership to 102.

The Sunday School continued to climb with an average attendance of 182 for the year and 203 excluding July and August.

Missionary giving increased by \$1000.00 to a total of \$3,177.39, yet at the present rate of giving the church will be debt-free in ten years time.

Weekday activities showed a healthy increase with youth groups in the 12 to 20 year bracket averaging 57, with another 53 in the 8 to 11 year

Statistics Show 339 Babies Born Last Year in Hospital

Statistics on the Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital's operation in 1965 released this week show there were 339 births and 80 deaths last year.

Other facts contained in the year-end summary show the number of admissions during the twelve month period at 1,920 adults and children, and the daily average number of patients in hospital at 50.2. On an average the number of newborn in hospital daily was 6.7.

The percentage of hospital beds occupied averaged 75.3, and the percentage of bassinets occupied in the nursery a average 41.7.

Patients in 1965 were hospitalized for an average of 9.5 day, and newborn were kept in hospital on the average for 7.2 days.

There were 1,733 emergency visits to the hospital last year, 822 operations, 158 of those

classified as major, and 4,886 x-ray examinations.

The hospital's physiotherapy department treated 392 patients with 4,042 treatments, performing an average of 60 treatments per day.

The laboratory was another busy department, processing 46,884 units of work. Another 5,232 units were referred to other laboratories.
