

Georgetown Juniors Score 3 As South Stars Rout North

The Southern all-stars paced by members of the Georgetown Raiders and Milton Merchants, whipped a hurting Northern all-star collection 7-3 in the first annual Central Junior C all-star game in Georgetown Memorial Arena Wed. night Jan. 26.

The South scored to a 4-0 lead in the first two periods and then added three more in the third to earn the win. The North scored both their goals in the final 20 minutes.

Injuries incurred in games on the weekend before the all-star clash forced the North to play some holes with second choice stars.

Five of the New Hamburg Hahns named to the Northern select, goaltender John Bremner, defenceman Doug Crossman and forwards Ken East, Ron Mack and Chuck Harmer were absent with injuries following a rugged game with Hespeler Shamrocks.

Tim Forler of New Hamburg was chosen to replace Bremner, while another Hahn, defenceman Rick Falk, took Crossman's spot. The select emergency recruits were left winger Ron Etch of Elmira, and Al Lennox of Hanover.

Georgetown Raiders' Bill Dwyer was the game's high points man with 2 goals and an assist. Joe Hore of the Milton Merchants also scored twice.

Paul Robinson of Georgetown, Eric Pass of Bradford, Chiefs, and Roger Wildfong of Milton Merchants scored the other goals for the South.

Jim Bell of the Hanover Hurricanes and Howie McDonald of Elmira scored the Northern team's goals.

Frank Marchiori of Milton and John Raycraft of Paris Mounties shared the goaltending duties for the South Marchiori blanked the opposition through two periods.

Jim Peters of Orangeville and Tim Forler of New Hamburg handled netminding duties for the North.

Georgetown Raider coach Gerry Inglis handed the Southern dream team and New Hamburg's mentor, Ron Forier, coached the North.

Referee Frank Slots handed out just five penalties during the game, three to the South and two to the North.

Four hundred fans were on hand to watch the proceedings despite zero degree weather and an NHL game between Montreal and Chicago on television.

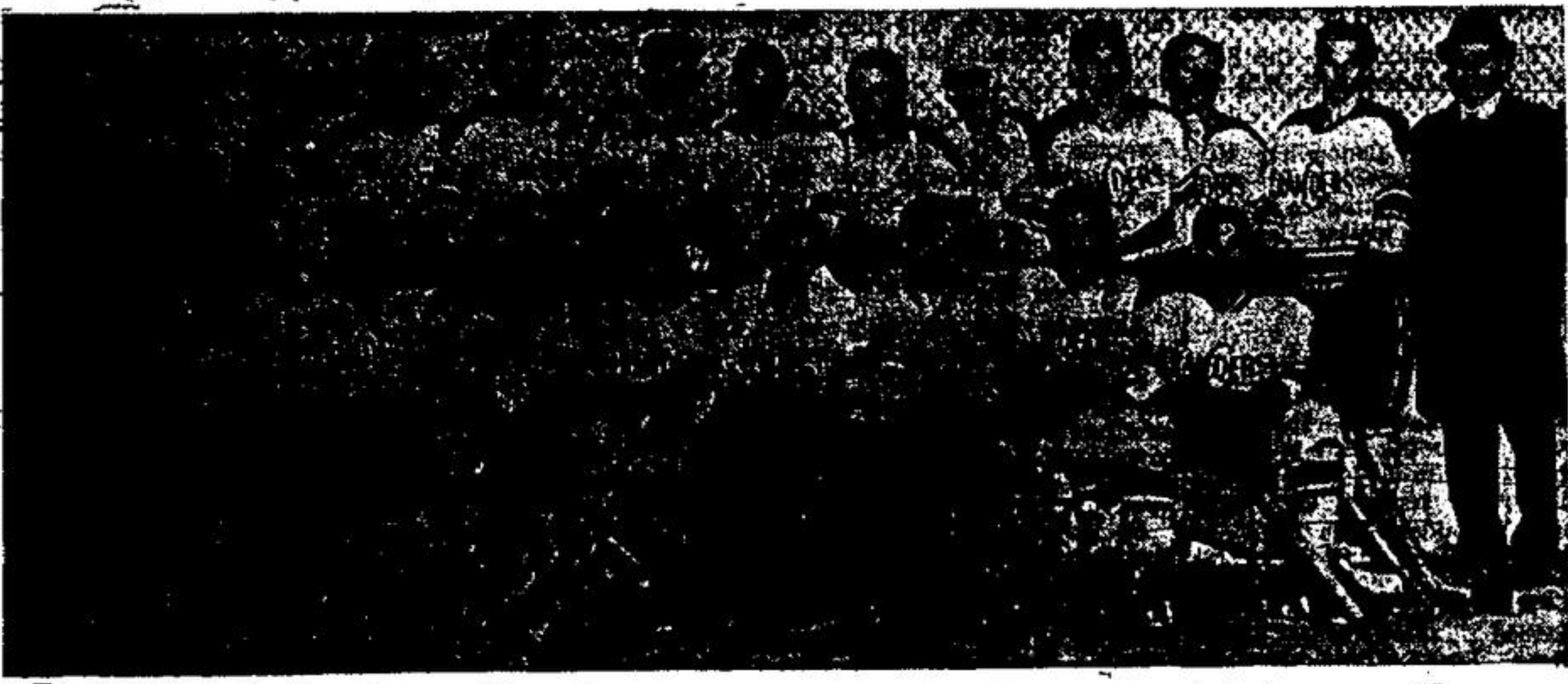

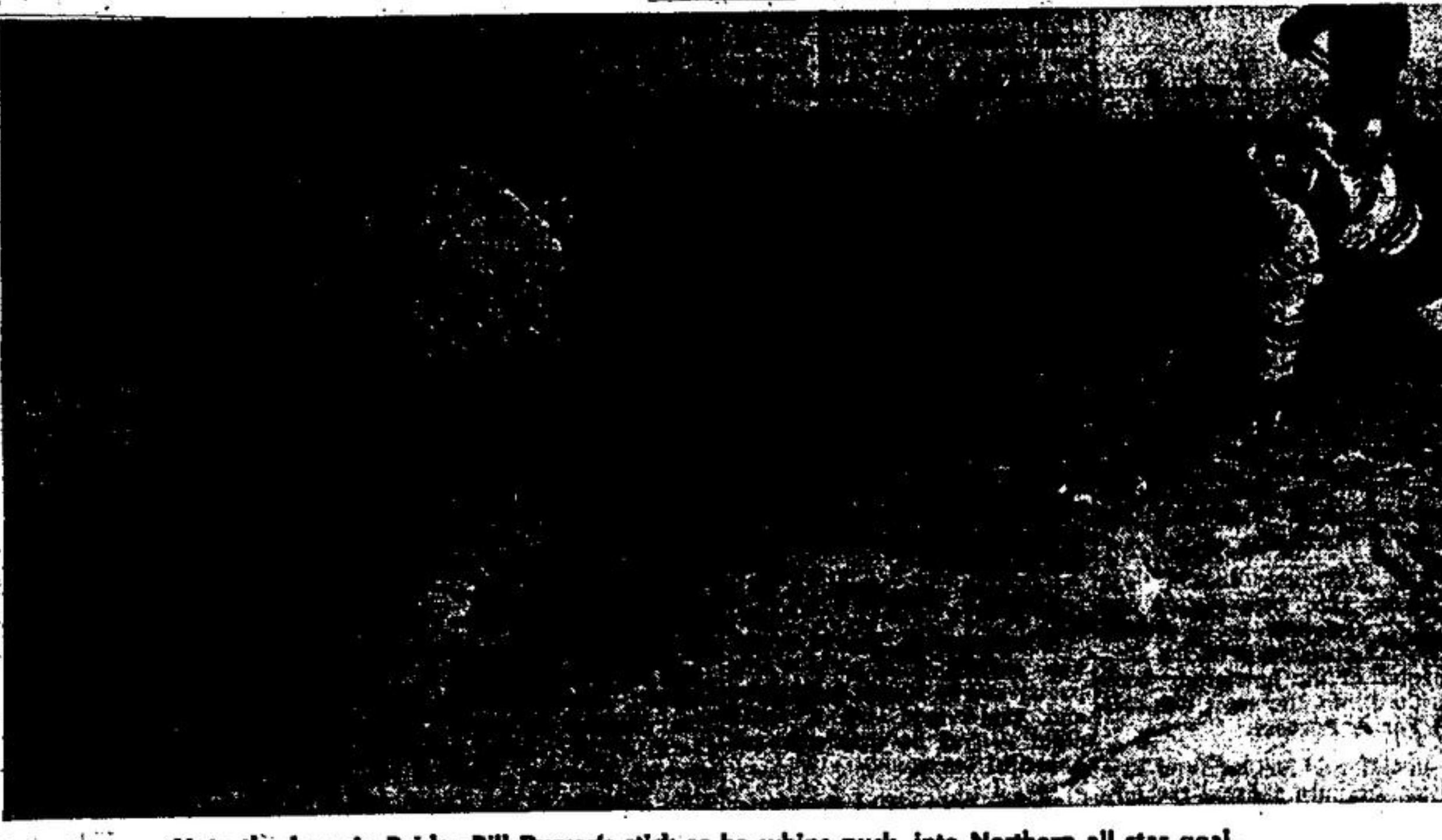
