

COUNCIL BRIEFS

Status of a property on Mountainview Rd. which was ordered rezoned in 1962, but for which the necessary legal work was not completed, is delaying a planned building on the property.

While the new owner says that the rezoning should be automatic, council has declined to act until the matter is again placed before Georgetown Planning Board.

Local 73 of the NUPSE union to which the town works staff belongs, has appointed Gilbert Telford as union steward.

Georgetown Baseball Association has received a \$350 grant to assist in meeting its 1966 budget.

The necessary by-laws have been passed for the town's new plant for removing iron from the water supply. Cost will be \$110,000.
