Georgetown Raiders have had to fold up their aspirations for a group championship and tuck them away for another year. A capacity crowd witnessed the showdown, after observing a moment's silence for Janet Moore, a young Raider fan who died when the car in which she was riding home from Raiders' Friday match was involved in an accident.

New Hamburg owned a 2-1 edge at the end of the first period. Paul Robinson pushed ahead 1-0, but the Hahns rebounded with markers by Ruthig, and Harmer, Farrell scored the only second period goal as New Hamburg strengthened their position, but Raiders came alive in the third period.

Rod Presswood, Don Norton, and Paul Robinson pumped in pucks in the early stages of the third period to reverse the complexion of the game. Farrell's second goal made it 4-1, but Terry Hay, a juvenile snatched the lead back for the Raiders just 35 seconds later.

It was the second time in the series that Georgetown had gone ahead in an overtime period only to surrender the win.
