Georgetown is seeking a full-time town engineer. Council decided to advertise on Monday, following resignation of William Carr. Mr. Carr has served the town on a part-time basis for some years, acting as building and zoning inspector on a retainer fee, with consulting services extra when required.

I don't see how we can operate a growing town of 12,000 without a full time man," said Deputy Reeve Young in making the motion to advertise Monday. "Whether it's in our budget or not it's a position we have to fill.

Mayor Gibbons was cautious. "I'll support this in this stage," he said. "It's a good way of finding out what a full-time man will cost."

Cr. Erna Hyde voted in opposition to the motion to advertise.

Georgetown's arrangement with Mr. Carr has continued since resignation some years ago of Douglas Wilson, who was a full time employee. He left here to take an engineering position with the air force and is now based in Ottawa.
