West opened his fourth best heart which was won in dummy. Since one spade must be lost in any case, I led a low spade from dummy. This was won by West, who continued hearts. A diamond is led from dummy and the Jack is successful.

A Georgetown cattleman, Howard Tarzwel paid top price at the complete dispersal sale of the purebred "Maycroft" Holstein herd of John J. May and Sons, Picton, held recently at the Hays Sales Arena, Oakville.

The Georgetown buyer paid \$1,500 for the seven year old "very good" cow Maycroft Supreme Shirley, who as a three year producer on Record of Performance 17,795 lbs. milk containing 630 lbs. fat in 365 days.

The top price was actually shared by Tarzwel and Hays International Ltd. when the latter bought two year old Maycroft Rockette Reflection Star for export.

Tarzwel also paid \$700 for a "very good" four year old cow.

The sale brought a total of \$32,585 for an average of \$509 for 64 lots.

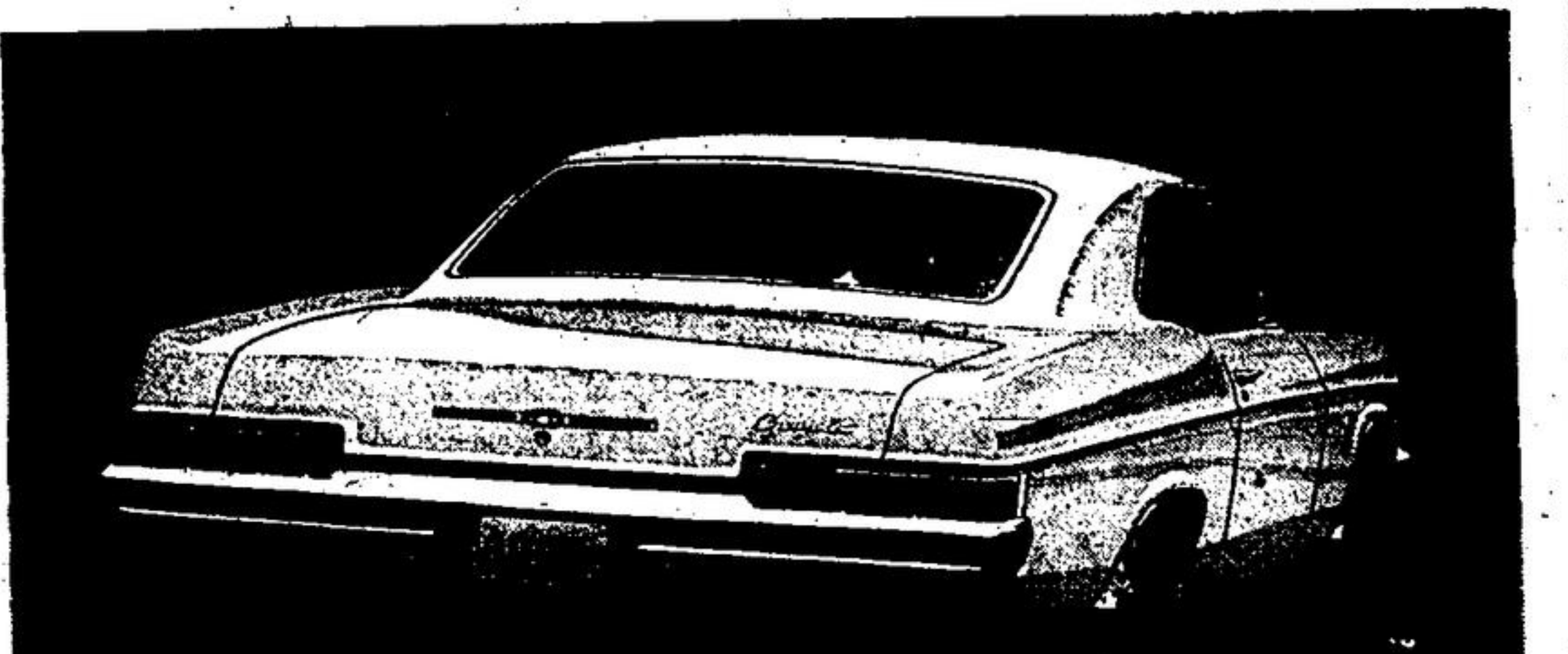
