**Ask Carr Draw Plans For Police Building**  
Ordering plans prepared for a proposed new police building on James St., council on Monday indicated it could still be interested in an addition to the present municipal building. Cr. Ern Hyde said he has "second thoughts" about spending \$18,000 on a police building which would be only a temporary remedy for overcrowding at the municipal building. He now thinks an addition might be more economical. Mayor Gibbons, who has favoured an addition from the start said council would have two plans and that costs can be compared before a final decision is made. When he said council's "first colossal blunder" was not to purchase the adjoining service station land, now in private hands, Cr. Hyde quipped "I disagree. It was when we let the old post office fall into private hands" (Mayor Gibbons was instrumental in quashing a plan to move the entire municipal office to that building). Cr. Ballentine reiterated his opinion that lack of parking precludes any building addition. A consultant's report indicates 123 works employees and 46 in the office by 1970, he said. A police building designed as a house, can be sold in future at little cost to the town, he said.
