Presbyterians Approve Ministers' Insurance

Approval for the setting up of a group insurance plan covering ministers was given by the Presbytery of Brampton of the Presbyterian Church in Canada at its meeting at Knox Church, Oakville, on Tuesday, May 17th.

Unlike most workers, ministers are responsible for their pulpits whenever they are absent, whether for illness or otherwise, except on vacation. This insurance plan is intended to assist in meeting this or other expenses caused by the illness of a minister, or to provide a lump sum in the event of his death. Many congregations are bearing the expense of this insurance to assist their minister. At this meeting plans were laid also for an exchange of pulpits by ministers which should further cement relationships in this newest Presbytery of the Church. It was reported by the Christian Education convener, Rev. R. T. Duncan, of Streetsville, that a successful inaugural Presbyterian Young People's Rally was held in Norval in April, with 120 young people attending from thirteen of the 20 pastoral charges of the Presbytery. Rev. R. D. Duncan, of Norval, a former Missionary in British Guiana, spoke on the theme "What Is Your Vision?" The following Presbytery P.Y.P.S. Executive was elected and installed: President, Elizabeth Evans, Hopedale, Oakville; vice president, Gary McEachern, Acton; secretary, Doris Robinson, Campbellville; treasurer, David Harley, Georgetown; Missions convener, Donald Young, Georgetown; Worship convener, Shirley Ella, Campbellville; Publicity convener, David Leggett, Knox, Oakville; Fellowship convener, Carson Smiley, Hopedale, Oakville.

Plans for the licensing and ordination of Victor Turner, student minister, of Grand Valley and South Lather, on Wednesday, June 15th, were made. Publication of a Presbytery News Bulletin by the Publicity Committee, convened by Rev. J. K. L. McGown, Milton, was agreed upon, and Rev. A. H. McKenzie, Acton, reported on the progress of the General Assembly's revision of the Book of Praise. It is planned to drop out unused hymns, and substitute more modern ones with suitable tunes of use to both young people and older members.

We have been asked what is happening to the Dr. Bebenek Memorial Fund... At present it totals a little over \$1500 and no firm decision has been made as to what form the memorial is to take.
