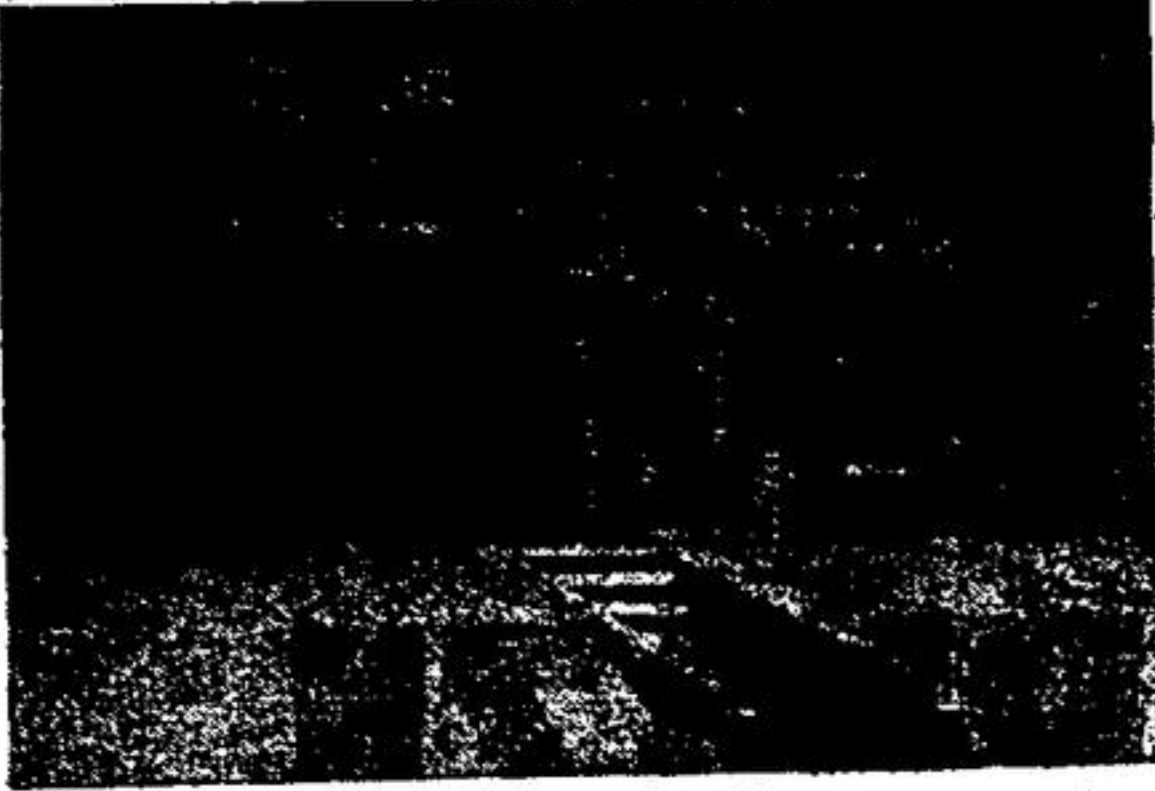

Treasury Officer with Federal Civil Service

A treasury officer with the federal civil service from 1925 until his retirement, Cory Vern Waldorf, 71, died suddenly at his home, 1288 Avon Crescent, Oakville, on May 19.

Mr. Waldorf directed the finances of the Canadian Navy for the east coast and north Atlantic during the second world war. He was a pay corps sergeant in World War I and served in France for three years.

Born at Avonmore, he was the son of Lemuel and Mary The Rutledge Music Store of that city and Eric musical artists in their own right. Also on hand for the occasion will be Mrs. Ann Riley an Irish soloist now residing in Galt.

He moved to Georgetown when he retired in 1957, moving to Oakville last October where he became a member of Maple Grove United Church.

He leaves his wife, Elizabeth Murray, whom he married in 1927 in Parkdale United Church Toronto; four children, Dr. Verne Ross Waldorf, Oakville, Paul Murray Waldorf, Montreal, Mrs. James Ronback (Mary) of Kitchener and F/O Jean Waldorf, RCAF, Halberg, Vancouver Island; a sister, Mrs. H.S. Cooke, Seely's Bay; and nine grandchildren, Kirsti and Lisa Ronback, Andrew, David, Patrick, Lee Anne, Susan, Jacqueline and Karen Waldorf.

Rev. W. J. Carson of Maple Grove United Church and Rev. Roy DeMarch, a former minister of Edgewood United Church, Halifax, conducted the funeral service in Oakville on May 21 and interment was in Trafalgar Lawn Cemetery. Pallbearers were O.R.
