

Wholesale Changes Made In Minor Hockey Executive

The Georgetown Minor Hockey Support Group which sponsors the town's Novice, Pee Wee, Bantam, Midget and Juvenile all-star teams has a completely new executive.

At a meeting in Cedarvale school Wednesday May 18, Harold Seckington was named president; Bob McMenemy Sr., vice-president; Don Jarvie, secretary; Ian Presgrave, treasurer; Del Beaumont, secretary-treasurer; and Bill Korzak Tri-County representative. With the exception of past president Art Sheppard, the slate of officers represents a complete change from last season.

Herb Robinson and Roy Norton Sr. are the Group's equipment managers and committee to bring the by-laws and constitutions up to date is composed of: Shel Lawr, Herb Arnold and Herb Robinson.

Discussion centred around expenses, in order to reduce costs next season some items

will be slashed from next season's budget.

Since the Group was formed in February 1959 the teams have made themselves known in Ontario Hockey Association playoffs as well as major tournaments.

The Midgets came through with the Group's first Ontario minor hockey championship in 1962-63. The Juveniles won an Ontario title in 1961-62, but they were sponsored by the Canadian Legion.

The Midgets repeated in 1963-64, and 1964-65.

The Pee Wees won their first Ontario crown in 1964-65 after making it to the finals twice before. They also won their division championship at the Goderich Tournament in 1964-65.

Bantams have reached the Ontario semi-finals twice as well as winning their division title in the International Tournament here in 1962 and 1965.

Georgetown Giants scored 4 runs in the fifth inning to earn a 7-7 tie with Milton Red Sox in a five-inning Halton Senior Baseball League encounter in the county town Monday night.

Milton led the locals 4-1 after one inning, 5-1 after two, 6-3 after three, and 7-3 at the end of four.

The game was called by the umpires with Georgetown batting in their half of the sixth inning.

In their big fifth inning Giants got singles from Bill Campbell, and pitcher Don Westbrook, a sacrifice by Brian McCristall, two bases on balls issued to Dan Arbie and Tom James, and three big Milton errors.

In their two-run third inning Pete Lawson tripled, and Jason Field and Campbell lined single.

Georgetown's first run came in the opening inning when the leadoff batter, Dan Arbie, double and third man up, Pete Lawson, singled him home.

Bratton started for Georgetown, and worked 2 1/3 innings before being lifted for Don Westbrook who hurled the remaining 2 2/3 frames. Bratton fanned 4 Red Sox, and walked 2 while giving up 3 hits and 6 runs. Westbrook struck out 6, issued free passes to 2, allowed just one hit and one run.

Milton's Naylor went the distance fanning 7, walking 3, allowing 12 Giant hits and 7 runs.

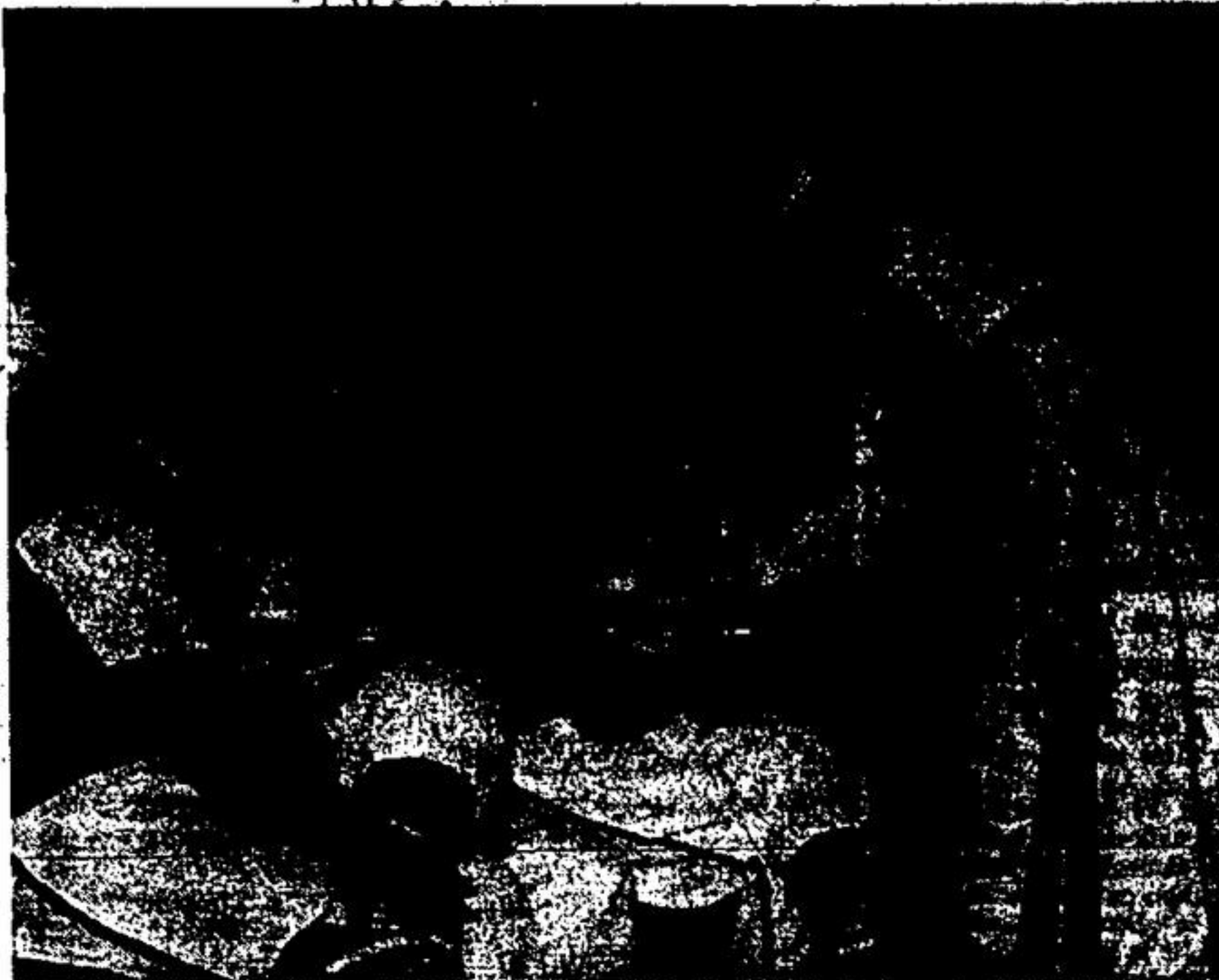
