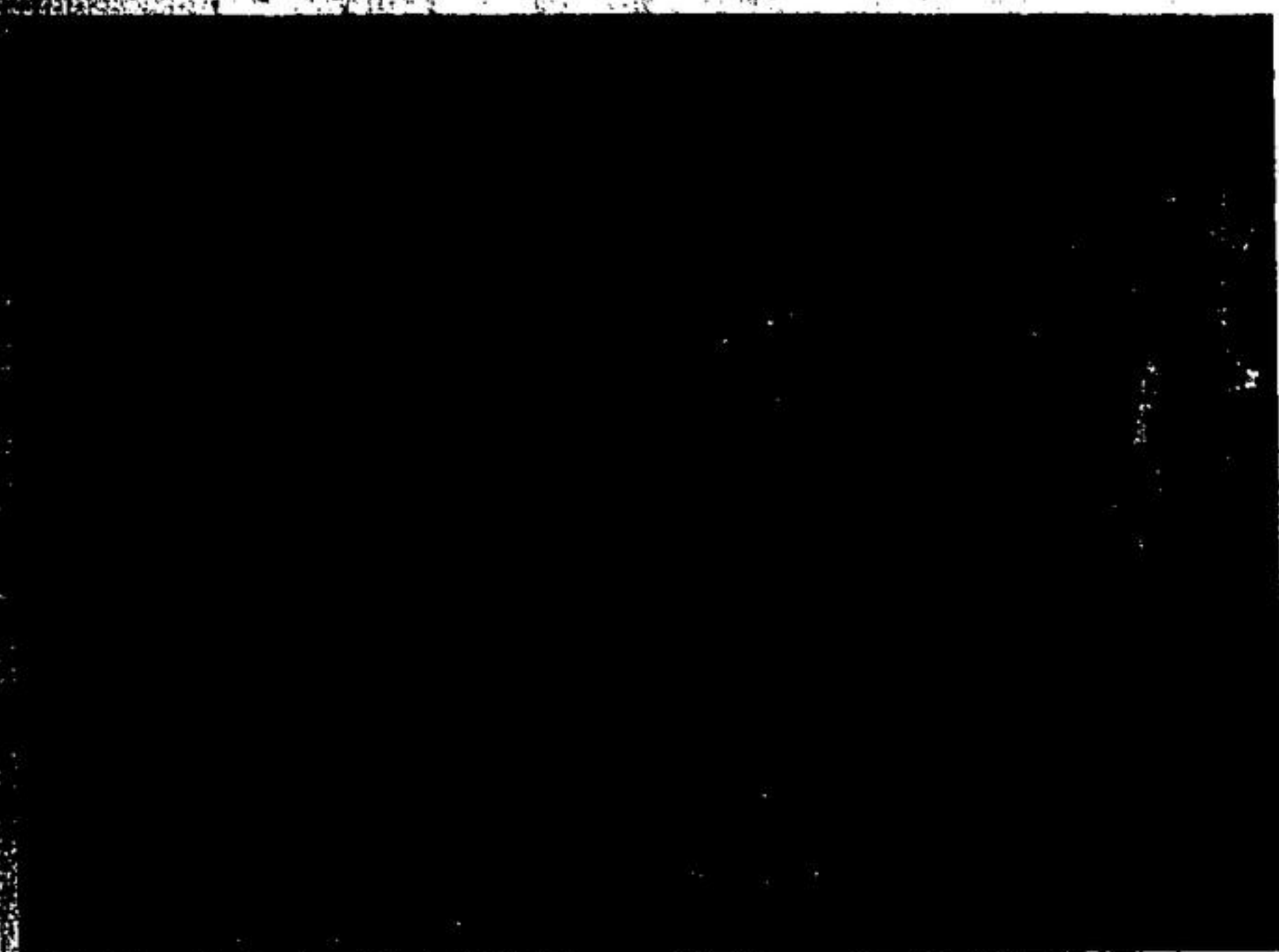
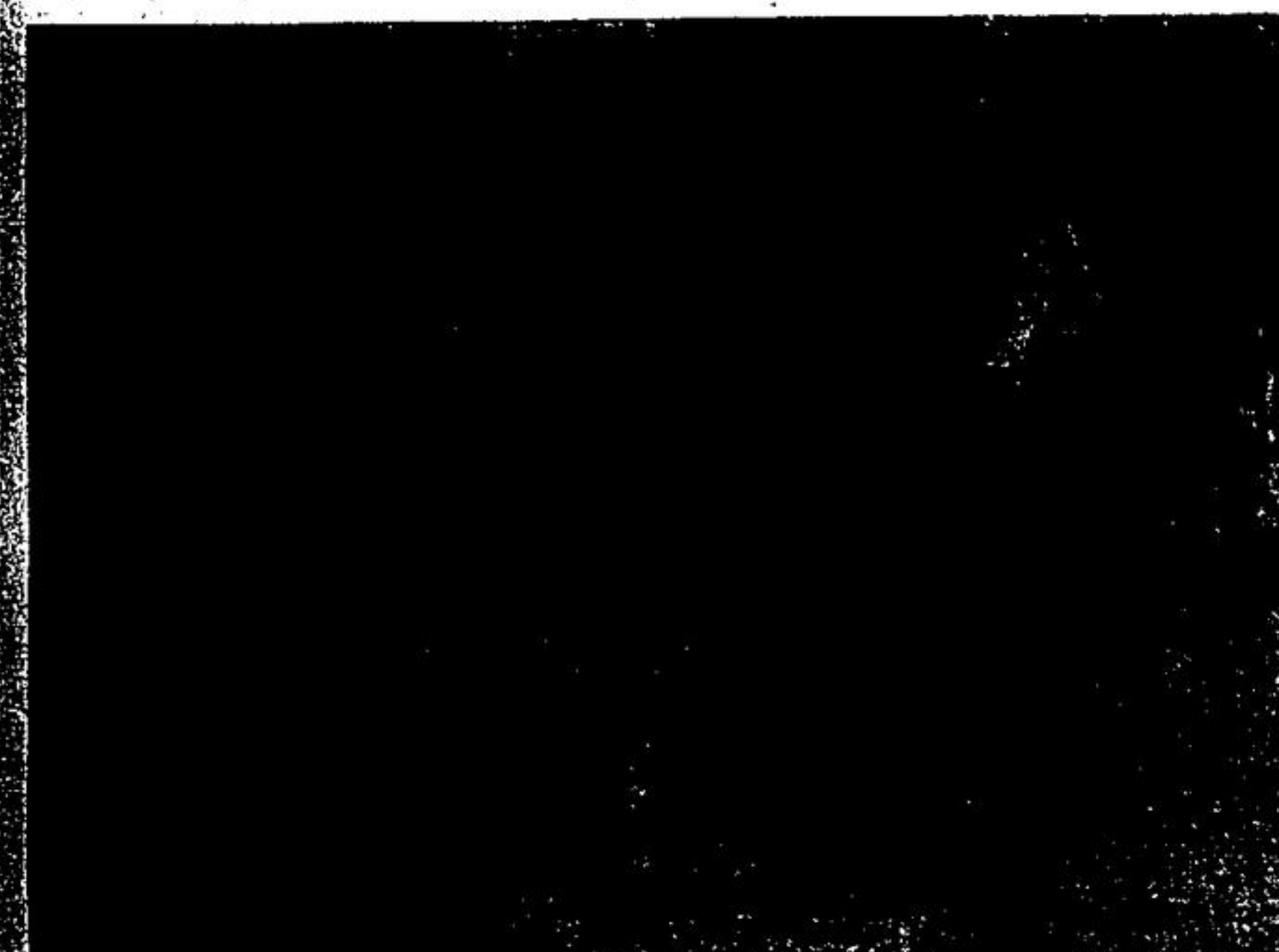


PHOTO FOCUS ON CEDARVALE PARK OPENING

Dorothy Stevens Noted Canadian Portrait Artist

One of Canada's foremost portrait painters, Dorothy Stevens, 79, died Sunday in Toronto Western Hospital. Her brother, F.L. Stevens, Russell Hill Road, Toronto, has a summer home on Maple Avenue just outside Georgetown's town limits.

Her paintings and etchings have been acquired by Toronto Art Gallery, The National Gallery of Canada, Edmonton Art Gallery and by collectors.

In private life Mrs. de Bruno Austin, a daughter of Daniel Benjamin (who also painted) and Bertha Christie Stevens, her interest in art showed itself at an early age. She studied at the Grande Chauxiere in Paris, studied in Spain on a travel scholarship from the Royal Canadian Academy and became a member of the Academy in 1949.

She illustrated books by Katherine Hale and made a series of six etchings for the Canadian War Memorial. Recently she had taught art classes in the city and portrait classes at Doon School of Fine Arts.
