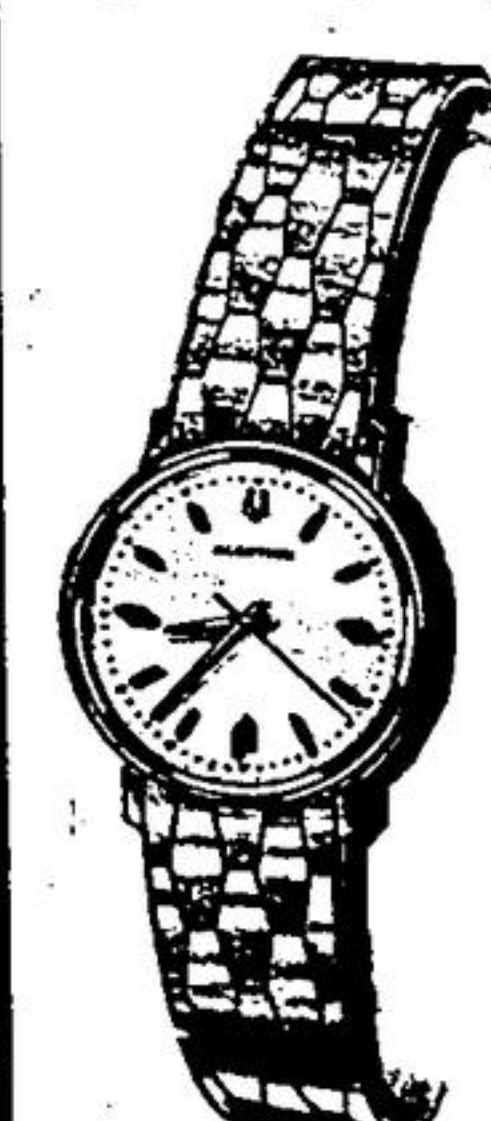
Many Prizewinners at Golf Club Penny Sale
