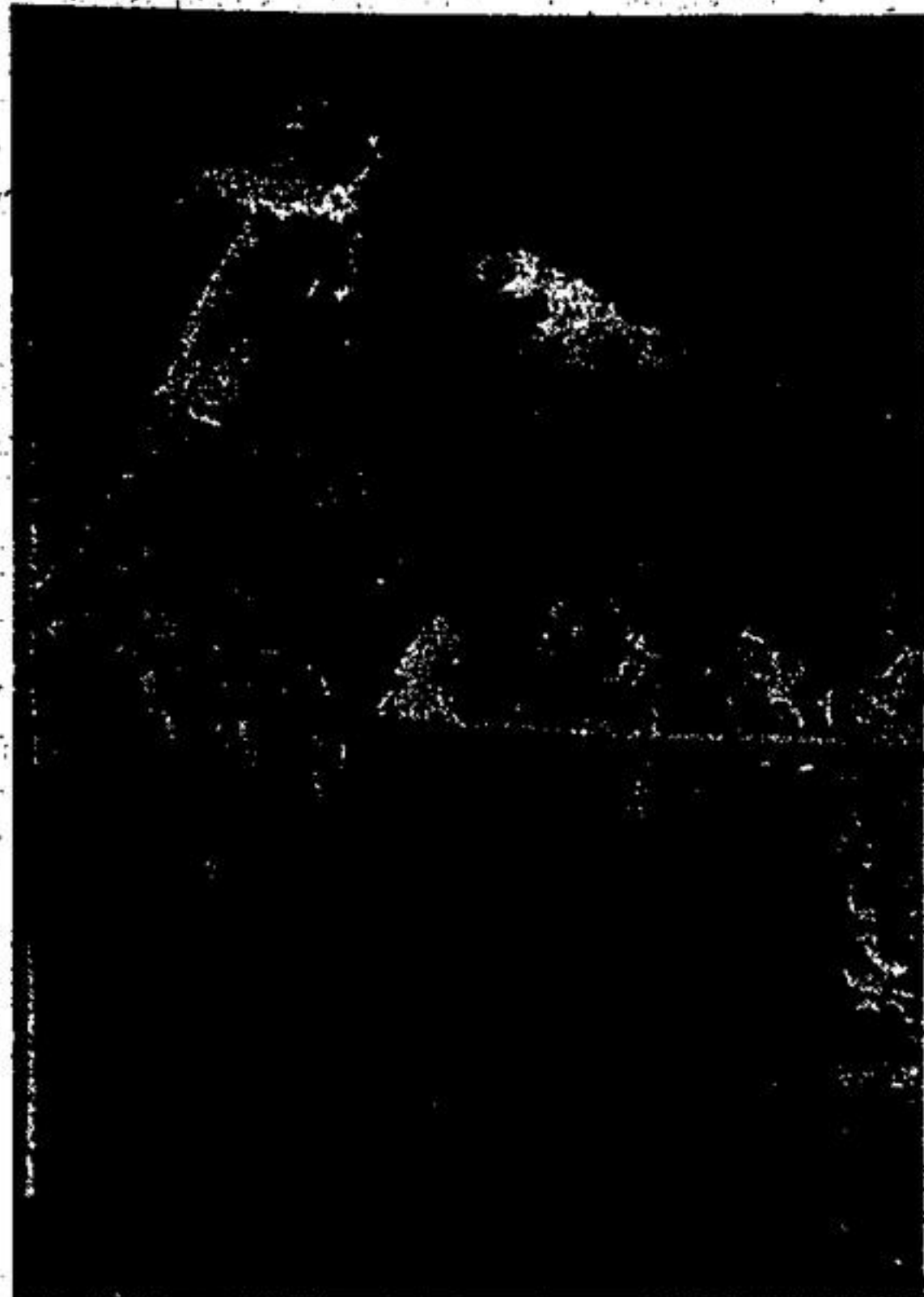


# Wrigglesworth Athletes Are Best At Inter-School Track & Field Day

Wrigglesworth Public School athletes captured the Georgetown Public Schools Field Day for their school by running up a total of 63 1/2 points in track and field events in the park on Friday, June 10th.

George Kennedy Public School was second with 56 points, Park school was third with 46, Harrison had 37, and Chapel Street 22 1/2.

Five points were given for a first place finish, 3 for second and 1 for third, except in relays when 10 points were awarded for a first, 6 for a second and 2 for a third.

Howard Ferguson and Kathleen Keire of Wrigglesworth accepted the championship trophy on behalf of their school mates. It was presented by Mr. William French, principal of Park school which earned the laurels last year.
