A woman well remembered as principal of Norval public school from 1902 to 1906, marked her 84th birthday at home in Naicam, Saskatchewan on May 4.

Mrs. Henry Loyns, who was Mrs. Barber before her marriage, had a party with several of her neighbours and other friends attending. Earlier this year the couple celebrated their 56th wedding anniversary. Mr. Loyns will be 90 this month.

Married at Norval in 1910, they are pioneers in the Lac Seul district where Mr. Loyns held on his homestead in 1905. Mrs. Loyns opened three schools after going to the area of Lewis Lake, Lac Vert and Dumbarston.
