Procor twice had runners on third with only one out and failed to score. In their sixth Rene Bouchard walked and went to third on a single by Joe Auger.

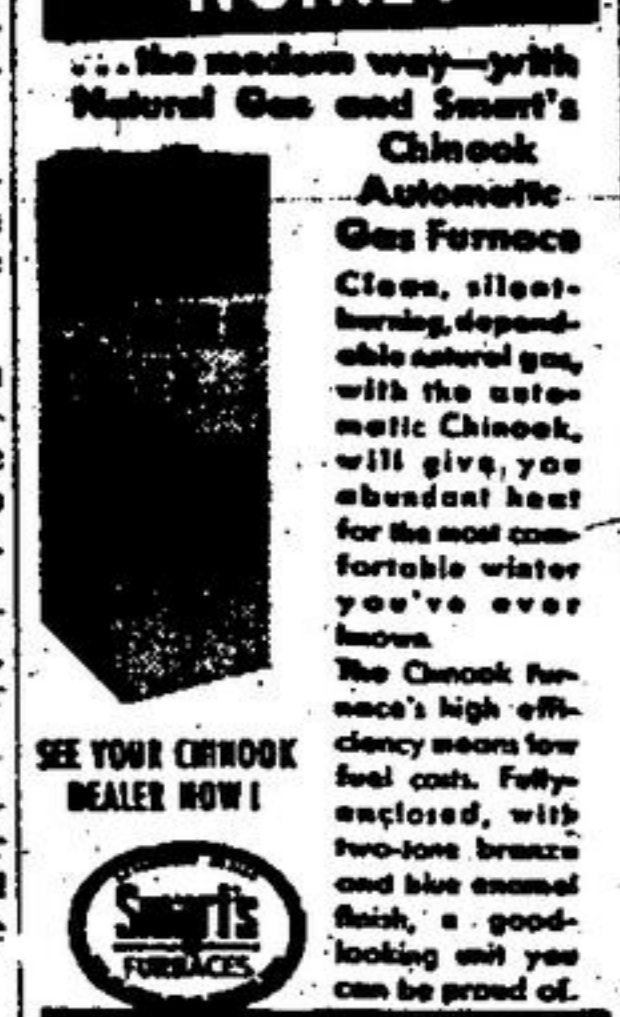
Willmott fanned the next batter, issued a free pass to Jones, and struck out the final batter to get off the hook.
