As part of the effort to reduce farm accidents, the ob servance of Farm Safety Week spensored by the Farm Safety Council of Ontario - July 24 to 30th was commended by the Honourable Wm. A. Stewart, Minister of Agriculture and Food


"As a result of the Ontario Department of Agriculture and Food's Farm Accident Survey in 1950-60, and the partial surveys undertaken by ten counties during the past three years it is evident that there are far many accidents on the farm today," Mr. Stewart pointed out. "Therefore, County and District Farm Safety Councils have been organized to work in co-oper_tion with the Farm Safety Council of Ontarie and the Department of Agriculture and Food Their work is reflected in the reduction of the number of accidents and human as well as Reasocial losses. However, this reduction is still not sufficient and we must all endeavor to increase our efforts toward making the farm a safer place

Accident prevention must become an integral part of farm management since the costs involved in accidents accidents have a considerable well-being of the farm family, bearing on the health, and invings in property loss.


