THE GEORGETOWN GOLF & COUNTRY CLUB membership is enjoying its finest season at the R. R. 4 Georgetown course and the major reason is an extensive addition to the clubhouse which recently reached the usable stage. Main feature of the addition is a roomy dining lounge (at left), three times the size of the club's previous lounge. A large fieldstone fireplace dominates the west end of the new hall and this massive "heart" of the room is the hub of the lounge area. In the foreground, modern furniture accents the spacious dining area. Below, part of the new locker area for the senior men members. Other facilities included in the addition are a sauna steam room, shower room, washrooms, office, and bar serving three areas. The Georgetown Golf & Country Club opened in 1959 as a nine hole golf course, became a championship 18 hole course two years later and has since been groomed into one of the top golf layouts in this part of the province. A swimming pool, playground, underground watering system, well stocked pro shop and scenic location are other features of the local club.

**Play-Off Time Approaches  
For Rural Softball Teams**

They're down to brass tacks in the Halton Rural Minor Softball Leagues. First to start playoffs will be the Midgets who launch the semi final round this Saturday, to be completed by Aug. 19. Finals will get underway Aug. 22 and wind up by Sept. 10.

Although the regular schedule has not been completed at writing time the standings won't be altered by the remaining games. Consequently Drumquin and Glen Williams have been paired in one of the semi-final series, while Hornby and Lowville will meet in the other. The semis will be best of three affairs, and the final best of five.

The Glen Drumquin set starts at Drumquin Saturday and the second game is slated for the Glen Park Sunday.

Hornby and Drumquin, and Omagh and Kilbride will look up in the Bantam division semi-final series which is to start Aug. 8 and wind up Aug. 19. The Bantam final will commence on the 22nd and wrap up Sept. 1. All series are best of three affairs.

A one-day elimination tournament will decide the Pee Wee division title in Hornby Park Aug. 27.

The first rounds between 12 noon and 4:30 will see Drumquin meet Hornby, Omagh, against Glen Williams, and Kilbride versus Moffat, in that order.

Lowville, which has gone winless in 11 games to date, gets a first-round bye to meet the Drumquin-Hornby set winners in round two.

Omagh or Glen Williams will meet Kilbride or Moffat in the semi-final, and the victors in round two and the semi-final will clash in the championship game.

The second round will start at 4:30, the semi-final at 6 o'clock and the final at 7:30.

The squirts will use the system to find the champion Sat., Aug. 13 in Hornby Park.

Using two diamonds, eight teams will take part in the opening round, which starts at noon and winds up at 3. Hornby vs. Moffat, Kilbride vs. Glen Williams, Drumquin B vs. Omagh, and Hornby A will play Lowville. Drumquin A gets a first-round bye.

Here is the rest of the elimination schedule:  
Second round: 3:00 Drumquin A vs. Kilbride or Glen Williams.

4:30 Hornby B or Moffat vs. Drumquin B or Omagh.  
Lowville or Hornby A get bye.

Semi Finals 6:00 Lowville or Hornby A vs. Drumquin A or Glen.

Finals 7:30 Lowville, Hornby A Drumquin A, Kilbride or Glen Williams vs. Hornby B, Moffat, Drumquin B, or Omagh.

**Save Farmland from Industry  
Is Scarborough Reeve's Plea**

Companies such as the Ford Motor Co. of Canada Ltd. should not be allowed to build plants on choice farmland, says Reeve Albert Campbell of the Toronto suburb of Scarborough.

Mr. Campbell told a seminar of the Central Ontario Regional Development Council, composed of Peel, Halton, York and Ontario counties, that it would be better for communities to ask companies to build plants on land unsuitable for farming.

"I think it is a crying shame when we allow such things as the Ford Motor Co. to go into Haltonville, take up a large chunk of their agricultural land and take it out of production and then let the satellite homes grow around when there are thousands of acres of land not suitable for agriculture."

Ford announced earlier this year it will build a plant at Haltonville near St. Thomas. Mr. Campbell said if action is taken now, the majority of good farmland can be saved.

He said if Scarborough had been properly planned with open space 15 to 20 years ago there might have been a permanent agricultural section, even as close as it is to Metro Toronto.

He felt satellite cities should be built on poor lands with rapid transit connections to large cities. Mr. Campbell said this would stop urban sprawl.

The association was formed between the four counties early this year. They are the last counties in Ontario to become involved in such a scheme.

The idea of regional development is to get a group of communities thinking and acting co-operatively in planning and developing for the common good.
