us in her problem of morals," said Mr. Pierce, "but that time has now passed. The problem has become exclusively our own."

"The increase in illegitimacy, a result of promiscuity and a general rebellion by youth against extant standards, should shock us out of our generally apathetic attitudes to these problems," he said. "These problems must not be shrugged off, or swept under the rug of indifference. Only as the problem is properly diagnosed can it be prescribed for, and the prescription will do us very little good on the shelf. We must take our medicine, and trust that under God we will be able to rectify the situation," Mr. Pierce continued.

"It is difficult to say whether the filthy literature flooding our newstands is a cause or an effect," said the minister. "It has aptly been stated, you become what you eat. This principle applies just as well mentally and morally. We determine what our children will be tomorrow by what we give them as food for thought today. Every civilization in history has been marked by its literature. National thought is revealed and the moral character of any nation can be ascertained by the colour and nature of its popular reading material," he continued.

"If the magazines and paperbacks on display by the thousands in this area are any indication of the moral standard of our country we have just cause for alarm," said the minister.

"Surveying the wide assortment of obscene and pornographic material on sale in many area newstands, it is small wonder that our generation seems to be obsessed with sex acts and perversion of every description. The filthy literature displayed for sale is a sign of moral decay, and points into sharper focus the necessity of a fresh evaluation of the seeds we are sowing, for these seeds will come to fruition and the harvest will not be pleasant."
