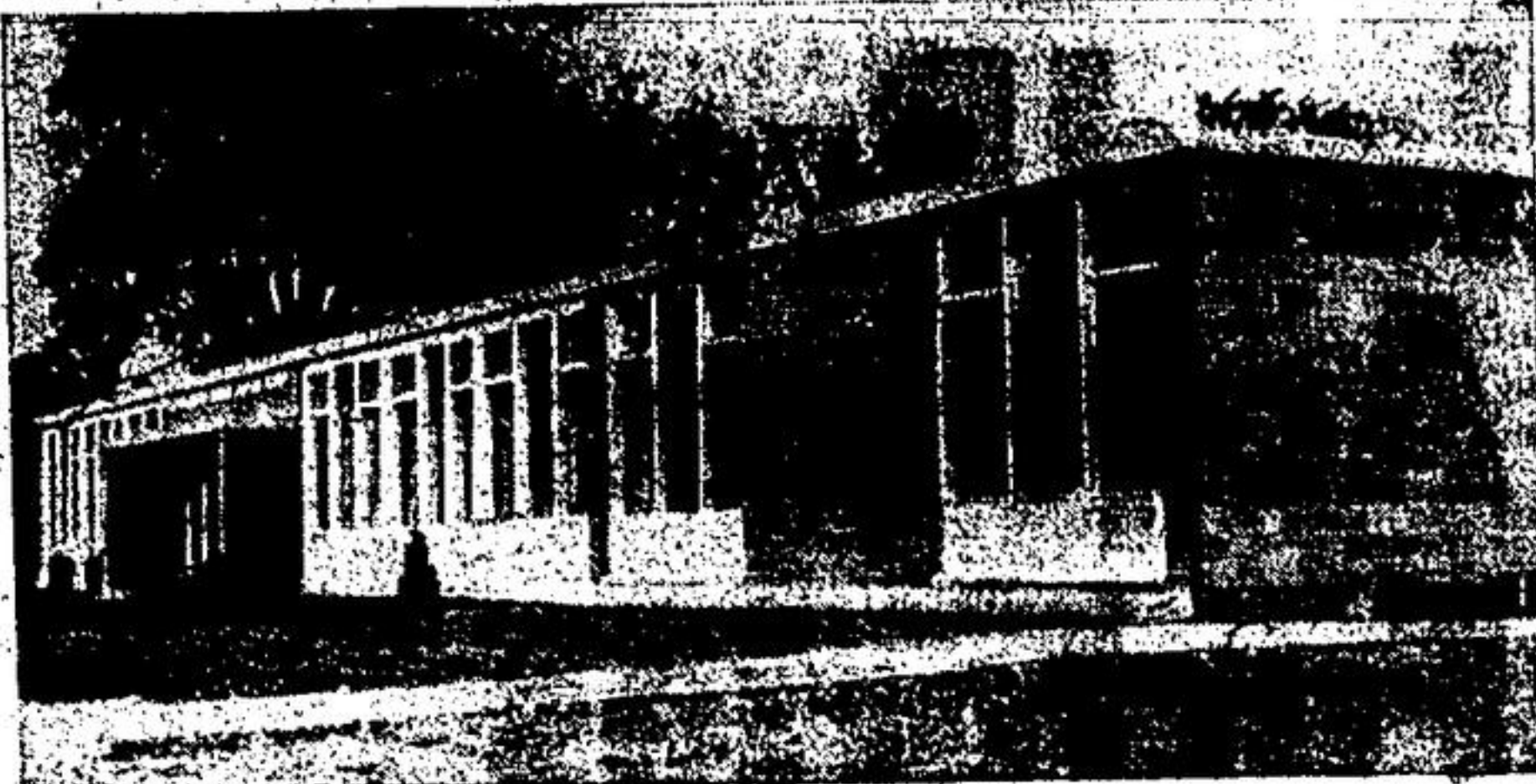


Christian School Size Swells To Five Rooms With Addition
