

# Many Pass Swimming Tests in August Classes at Local Pool

48% of the beginners taught by instructors Chris Eargent, Lisa, Dianne Foster, and John Johnson, successfully passed the Red Cross Beginners Swimming Test on August 24th.

While 53% of the total enrollment of the Junior class passed actually the percentage was higher since of the 48 actually taking the test, 37 passed or roughly 78%. Holiday time plus pre-tests cuts into the number who are on hand to take the test.

Instructors for the Junior class were Ray Fox, Ian Gosling, John Golden and Richard Holmes.

The same instructors, teaching the Intermediate class saw

58% of their pupils pass, while the Seniors under the guidance of Ray Fox, had 54% of those eligible to take the test pass. Ten of those registered in this class were too young to take the Red Cross test.

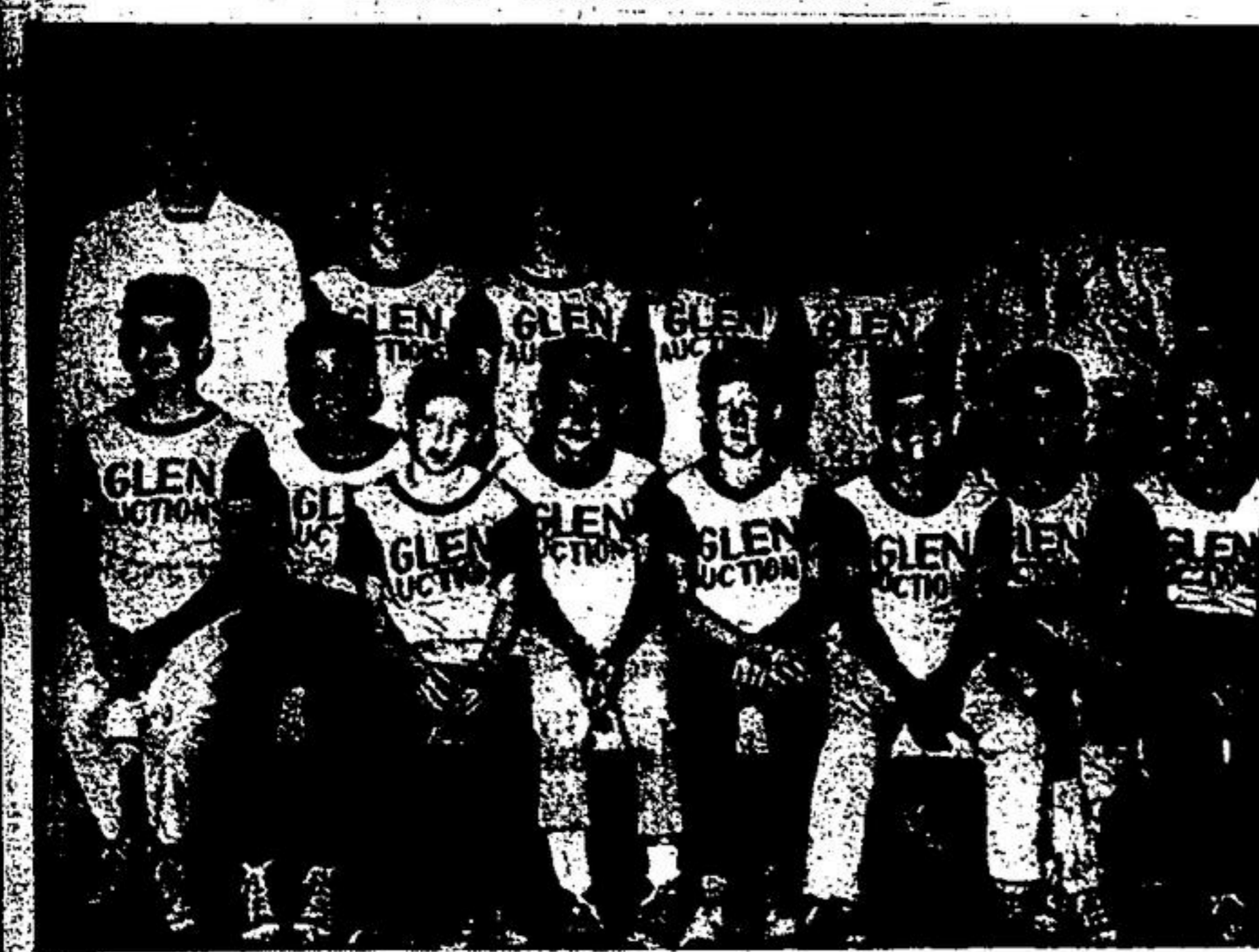

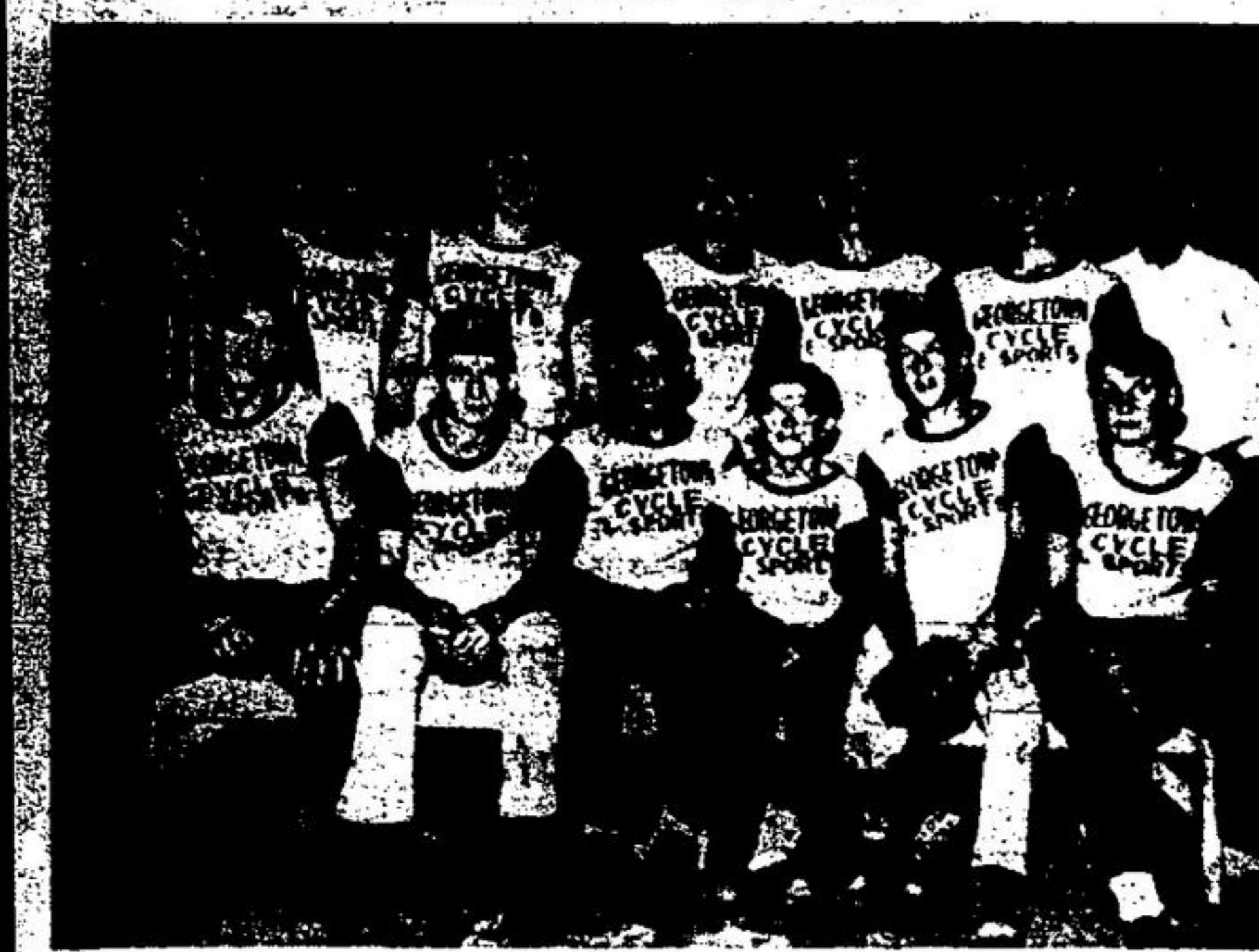
